Shondell informed us on the 'why,' commenting on the water crisis in California and how that could soon effect us here in Alberta.

The Global Grant project was just recognized in the zone 25A meeting in Merida, Mexico. Jennifer Jones presented it to the lead Colombian Rotarians. Colombian District 4281 is the Host District with strong support from Rotary Club of Nuevo Ibague.

Nearly 3200 Ponseti splints will be loaned out to qualified clinics countrywide. These braces eliminate almost all the need for corrective surgeries for affected children. Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park took the international lead in the project. Supporting grants from other Calgary clubs made a big difference and helped reach a budget of CAD176505






NEW MEMBER PROPOSAL
