Special Announcement: President Jim made a couple of announcements. He asked that we check the Bulletin last week for notes from the Board meeting regarding the Budget amount available for distribution by the various Committees this year. Some are off to a good start in donating some \$700,000. He also reminded us of next weeks Cleven Awards and gave us a sneak peak of the awardee's names... Stay tuned.

He called on **Len Hamm** to give us a report on the **<u>Ribbons for Peace</u>** event. Len thanked the Committee for all the work they put in and for the support from all the members with purchasing tickets and Silent Auction items. He was proud to announce that the event raised some \$173,000 after expenses In addition, last Spring, the Richardson Family donated \$100,000 to the relief effort. This was in honor of Jeanettes parents and her Brother.

This has now been added bringing the total fund to \$273,000 and following Board approval they have starting to donate to the greatest needs in the Community. Some \$30,000 has been allocated to ESL and another \$10,000 to obtain a matching amount of Gift Cards from the Calgary Coop. All in all a great effort and the standing ovation was well deserved. Speaker Introduction: Darlene Switzer-Foster

Our guest speaker Rabbi Ilana Krygier was introduced by Darlene Switzer-Foster. Rabbi Ilana was born and raised in Calgary, she is married to David, has three grown children and a large dog!

She has volunteered and served many organizations including the Calgary Jewish Academy, Temple B'nai Tikvah, and the Calgary Jewish Federation as the Director of Programming and a Holocaust and Human Rights Educator. She has also served on various Boards along with really serving lunches at the Drop -In Centre.

In 2020, after a long-long dream, she obtained her Rabbinic Ordination and has recently become certified as a Grief Educator through the David Kessler Foundation.

Main Presentation: Rabbi Ilana Krygier

Rabbi Krygier indicated that the message of Hannukah is to bring "light into darkness. The eight day event is not a religious holiday but a minor holiday in the Talmudic tradition o the Hebrew Calendar. Their calendar does not conform to our tradition Gregorian model, and they attempt to celebrate Hannukah at the same time every year.

The story is from the book of Maccabees and its history dates to approximately 170 BCE. It celebrates the end of a three-year civil war. The Maccabee tribe won the victory and after cleansing the temple they had very little oil for the temple candle. However, the candle remained lite for eight days and hence the eight candles on the Menorah. A traditional religious Menorah has only seven candles. Tradition has it that each evening one of the candles is lit. She invited us to think of it as our phone battery being on 10% and lasting 8 days! She also enlightened us to the fact that it do not matter how we spell Hannukah as it is a Hebrew word that isn't directly translated, which is good because I am sure we have spelled it 3 different ways in this Bulletin!

Along with the candle lighting, food is prepare and it should be fried in oil. Today families give presents and play with a dreidel on the table. Darlene Switzer-Foster has presented us all with a gift and a dreidel. Rabbi Krygier sang one of the songs that are traditionally sung at this time.

The essence of Hanukkah is a message of tolerance and acceptance between all peoples.

Thanking the Speaker: Dilan Perera

Dilan Perera thanked Rabbi Ilana today. He acknowledged that this was the third time we have celebrated Hannukhah with a presentation by her and it was always welcome. It did us good as individuals and as a Club to learn about the various traditions in our Community.
