Steve Mason came up and up and gave us some history on The Cleven Award.

This special internal award of the Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park was established in 2006 to recognize the outstanding contribution of club members who take on significant responsibilities and commitments in furthering the work of our club.

The award is named the "Cleven Award" in honour of and recognition of Harry Cleven, first president of the Manchester Rotary Club in 1955, now known as The Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park. Cleven was a very active Calgary community leader and a well-known and respected businessman. He was one of 62 people who were killed in the crash of a TransCanada Airline flight which crashed on Mt. Slesse near Chilliwack on December 9th, 1956. He made many positive contributions to the start-up and laid a strong foundation for our club.

The Rotarian who received this award today is **Luanne Whitmarsh.**

Craig Stokke came up to share a bit about **Luanne** and some of the many amazing things she has done. The list is very extensive and very impressive!

Steve Mason presented **Luanne Whitmarsh** with the award. **Luanne** then gave a few lovely words. She shared the story of how **Frank King** brought her to the club in 2011. **Luanne** brought Jeannette king as her guest today along with her daughter in law Tania Killam. **Luanne** shared how this Rotary club has become her friends and her family over the years.
