Norm Legare introduced the program. "Fellow Rotarians, guests and past recipients of the Cleven Award. I am proud to be the chair of the Cleven Award Committee. I would like to introduce the Committee to you – Larry Koper, Greg Martin, Steve Mason, Jamie Moorhouse, Benno Nigg, and Bryan Walton. I want to thank you all for your participation on this Committee. It is a very challenging task to choose a recipient or recipients from the nominees.

Every year we are tasked with choosing 1, 2 or 3 recipients and each year the challenge becomes more difficult, with the great nominees presented by you to our Committee for consideration. Members, please be proactive in nominating Club members to receive this coveted award, so we have enough time to provide due consideration.

The Award is named in honour and recognition of the first president of the Rotary Club of Calgary South chartered as the Manchester Rotary Club in 1955. **Harry Cleven** was a very active Calgary Community leader and a well-known and respected business man. He was one of 62 people who were killed in the crash of a TransCanada Airlines flight which crashed on Mt. Slesse near Chilliwack on December 9th, 1956. He helped to develop the strong foundations upon which our Club is built.

The criteria for receiving the Award is as follows:

- The Award recognizes a strong commitment to and involvement in all Club activities.
- The nominee should be an active participant in Club committees, who accepts major responsibilities in the committee. They should demonstrate a strong work ethic and timely completion of commitments.
- Members of RCCS with membership of at least
 5 years qualify for this Award.

Nominees for this Award mast have an attendance over the last three years of at least 75%.

This is one of my favourite meetings of the year and I am glad you are all here to celebrate with us. This is a time of the year when we settle back and reflect on the past year — our accomplishments, our best memories and our plans for sailing into the New Year. Tonight we reflect on a couple of valued Members of our Club who contribute to our success in so many ways.

He makes all the Members and guests feel welcome. In addition to that, if the House Committee needs assistance he pitches right in and helps.



It gives me great pleasure to let you know that we have reached the magical **\$1,000,000.** goal for the Rotary Atrium.


