BULLETIN CHAIR: Bev Ostermann EDITOR: Glenn Potter PHOTOGRAPHER: Clive Pringle **Past President Terry Allen** thanked his committee, especially **Earl Huson** and **Don O'Dwyer** for their assistance in the preparations for these awards.

Terry informed us that Harry Cleven was the first president of the Rotary Club of Manchester later to become the Rotary Club of South Calgary and then Calgary South.

Harry was born and raised in Winnipeg and his early work included banking and accounting with Canadian General Electric and a chain of stores in Western Canada. He was transferred to Calgary in 1954 by Hilton Bros. Ltd. to finalize and build their local plant which manufactured corrugated shipping containers.

Harry was an active community member, sang with the Barber Shoppers, was a vice president of the Better Business Bureau and the Winnipeg Canoe Club. In Calgary he joined Rotary and in 1955 became the first president of the Manchester Club.

The Club started with 44 members one of which is sitting at our head table, **George Adam**. The Club swelled to 52 members and grew in stature and was more widely recognized in the Calgary Community.

Unfortunately Harry died in the crash of an Air Canada plane flying from Vancouver to Calgary after the 1956 Grey Cup Game. Calgary South is pleased to continue to recognize the significant contributions of Harry Cleven to the community by giving the Cleven awards to members of our Club who continue to emulate the same valued characteristics that were prominent in his career.




