

President Elect **Bryan Walton** opened the meeting with not one but THREE very lame jokes!!


The St. Mary's Choir then led us in Oh Canada and we sang Rotary Grace, which some of the Student knew!

Special Presentation: St. Mary's Choir

Our St. Mary's Choir conductor Jeremy and Principal Toni Dawson each spoke of the partnership between the club and the school. Toni indicated they are extremely grateful for all the support they receive, The Academic Scholarships, Youth Development program, the Four Way Test Speeches to name only three are great example of how we are integrated with the school. He pointed out that the choir accompanist Chris Santos, is a former St. Mary's student and is currently doing his student teaching at the school. The St. Mary's staff has many former students from the school. He also referred to Stan Cichon as a Principal of NOTE. He then thanked the club for providing the lunches for the choir.

Jeremy spoke of how important it is for the students to come out and see us. For them to learn how we do so much for them. He informed us that our support of the music program provides funding for professional musicians to come to their spring Music Camp and workshop with the students. The 20 Choir Students who came today were here on their own time, their last day of school was yesterday. The choir rehearses two days a week before school and their rehearsals are not included in their regular class timetables. He then invited the club members to come to their Annual Big Band evening on Feb. 25th. Dance music is provided by the Stage Band, a part of their concert band program.











Main Presentation: Cleven Award

THE CLEVEN STORY

As told by George Adam, Charter Member of the Rotary Club of Manchester

Harry Cleven was born in Winnipeg on September 11, 1910 and obtained his education there.

(Maybe it was prescient that the Rotary Club of Winnipeg was charted two months after his birth on November 3, 1910)

His earlier jobs included two years with a bank, six and a half years with the Canadian General Electric Company in the accounting division, and five years with Robinson Little Co. Ltd – a chain store company where he supervised set up and operations in towns across Western Canada.

In January 1940, Harry joined Hilton Bros Ltd. He was manager of the Home Insulation Division at Winnipeg at the time of his transfer to Calgary in January 1954 as their Alberta Manager who finalized the building and operation of their local plant that manufactured corrugated shipping containers.

Before leaving Winnipeg, Harry served on the Board of Directors of the YMCA for 12 years, Rotary Club for 10 years, and was a life member of the Winnipeg Canoe Club. He sang in the Winnipeg Chapter of the Barber Shoppers and was instrumental in forming the local chapter. In Winnipeg, he was the Vice President of the Better Business Bureau and also assisted the Bureau when he arrived in Calgary.

In Alberta he was a member of the Petroleum Club, The Chamber of Commerce, the Manufacturer's Association and Clare Lethbridge's Riverview United Church. So he was not only a joiner but a leader.

In his free moments, Harry loved to head out into the country with his trailer and family, with his wife Mary, and children Jim, Susan and Jeffrey. When Harry was President of our Rotary club in late 1955, he shared some interesting highlights in his report, stating: We started with 44 members, and we now have 52, having lost a few to the east. We are growing in stature and are becoming known in the community. A most active Inner Wheel organization has appeared. Treasury is healthy with a balance of \$2,254.66 President Harry thanked his directors and committee chairmen for their efforts during this formative year.

Harry Cleven was one of 62 passengers that perished on TCA Flight 810-9 when it crashed on Mt Sleese near Chilliwack BC with a group returning from the Shrine East West CFL All Star game played in Vancouver – December 9, 1956. He was 46 years old.

She had invited her sister to the meeting but had not told her why. They were both in an "emotional state" and Corinne felt that her parents would be watching! She remembered how she and her sister "always giggled when they were in church!" and she alluded to the fact that being in Rotary was like "being in a family". John Fitzsimmons and Joe Connelly were two important members in this regard. Joe especially encouraged her to join the club in 2011. In addition to her business ventures, she was looking for something that would enable he to support charity work and help to care for the vulnerable people in our city. Joe informed her of what our club did in this regard. She felt privileged to be part of the "Cleven Legends" and how Rotary changes lives - " She Gets It!" She has two signs in her office that read, "The more you Give the more you Have" and "Be the person your dog thinks you are!" She fondly recalls the conversations with Larry Kwong about the Chinese New Year especially one when he requested that the restaurant chef put more cashews in the chicken dish as there weren't enough last year! In her editing days she just couldn't get all of Jim Hutchens inflections in his "Ode to the Hagis" When Covid struct her business collapsed and she certainly needed some critical distractions to add to her simply looking at the four walls in her apartment and so she threw herself into working on her various Rotary committees, especially "Kids at Heart". This program has made a big impact in the community and she's already receiving calls about next year. In addition, Len Hamm's program illustrates just how powerful our club can be. She really loves being part of the partners and in a broader context the two million clubs in the world. She's going to be extremely proud to display her certificate.














Main Presentation: Cleven Award

John Fitsimmons came up to receive his certificate and Bryan read the caption on the document.

John spoke:

He joked about how Chas was speaking to us from Idaho Falls and anyone who has travelled to Palm Springs would recognize the wall paper of the hotel in Idaho Falls where Chas was speaking from. John used to metaphor of "being affiliated with a GANG!" He feels that there is no bigger gang out there than Rotary. He takes great pride in the fact that Rotary undertook the challenge to eradicate polio and he's proud to wear the Rotary colours. Similarly we have undertaken to support the Ukraine refugees to our city and we've just "done it". But he reminded us that we've "all done it" and that's what's important. He gave a "great big thanks" to the club for this honour. Wear the colours and ride for the brand!



Bryan called **Norm Devitt** to the mic. Norm pointed out that he has known John since he was a "little guy!" He's grown up to be a pretty good guy. Norm coached him in hockey and he was always a "go getter". He never liked to just sit down and he was an inspiration to others around him. Norm asked John's wife what his middle name was and found out that it was "Francis". Norm and John's dad also played ball together and coached the kids together. When Springbank needed to build a hockey arena they helped to fund the project. Norm offered his thanks and congratulations to John.


