ALBERTA POWER INDUSTRY UPDATE "THE INSIGHT BEHIND THE HEADLINES"

Terry Allen introduced one of own Members as our Speaker today.

Jim Fitzowich has been a Rotarian at the South Club for 21 years. He lives in Bay View, is married to Kathy for 25 years and has 4 children - 2 boys and 2 girls, all grown and independent.

Professionally, Jim is an electrical engineer with 29 years' experience in the North American Midstream Energy industry. "Midstream" is the new term for the old "Utilities" business - pipelines, processing and electric power.

He is currently the Managing Director of Western Power Partners. He has served as a senior executive and officer of such power companies as, Epcor Power LP, TransCanada Power LP, Pristine Power and Veresen.

Jim is a past Board Member of the Independent Power Producers of Alberta (IPPSA) and the Board of the Power Pool of Alberta when the current de-regulated power market industry was created.

He will speak today on some basic background on Alberta's power industry and hopefully shed some light on the numerous news articles on the impact of the current Governments policies, legislation and lawsuits are having on the industry."

Jim recognized other 'power' professionals: **Rod Hemstock, Ted Rowsell** and **Don Bacon** who all had esteemed careers in the profession.

The recent issues we hear so much about in the media are a result of the government regulators and power companies in a challenging relationship. Since November 2015 the Climate Leadership Plan drove the entire changes and the shutdown of coal production.


The government sued all power companies and their own resources and they mandated price cuts. The electricity overview has 4 components; generation, transmission, distribution and retail.

Alberta has a very large electrical system for the size of the province (it is larger than Saskatchewan and Manitoba system combined). Currently 2/3 of the power is produced by coal; it is cheap and efficient. The low cost to produce energy made the province a lot of money.

Power is priced per hour as every day of every year the demand for power dictates the cost. The market is currently paying below cost to produce power – power companies are losing \$2-3 billion annually and it is not projected to get better until 2019.

A power purchase arrangement is the contract between the producer and buyer and is common in the power industry. The changes in law clauses are common and long term agreements cannot always predict changes in the markets.

The Alberta Climate Leadership plan is the target for emissions. Alberta produces ¼ of Canadian C02, Canada produces 1.6 megatonnes of C02. China is at 24.5% and USA is at 13.9% for comparison. The government hastened the closing of coal production and this has really hurt people, companies and communities. With all the reduction in producers – the government is now the biggest emitter of C02 through their balancing pool. Please pay attention to the references – you may find more information helpful (but really, I hope you find something more to do with your time!).

Membership Committee: Al Johnson

Al updated the Club on the Membership qualifications and classification process.

In our Rotary manual it states that Club shall be compromised of active members each of whom shall be an adult person of good character and good business, professional and/or community reputation.

- 1. Engaged as a proprietor, partner, corporate officer, or manager of any worthy and recognized business or profession: or
- 2. Holding any important position in a worthy and recognized business or profession or any branch or agency thereof and have executive capacity with discretionary authority: or
- 3. Having retired from any position in sub-section 1 or 2: or
- 4. Being a community leader who has demonstrated through personal involvement in community affairs a commitment to service and the Object of Rotary: or
- 5. Having the status of Rotary Foundation alumnus as defined by the Board.



Qualifications from our Club Bylaws state:

Potential new member needs to attend 3 or 4 meetings. Fill our membership proposal/referral form stating the proposer and seconder. Then there is the interview where we discuss the Service (dream home, country thunder and casino expectations) and Benefits of a membership (giving back to the community) but we are not a Chamber of Commerce.

We review the 4-way test, how they will make friends, and how energetic the meetings are. We explain about the Partners group and that Attendance is expected at 85% and of those 65% needs to be at our meetings. We spend time telling the proposed member that it costs around \$3,000.00 annually to belong.

Each new member will complete a police security check, have their names presented to the Board, have their names in the Bulletin for 2 issues. Then, for the second interview the person will pay their initiation fee, get a name badge with red stripe.

In order to have the red stripe removed the new member must attend a Board meeting, do a make-up, complete their classification talk, participate in fund raising, attend a committee meeting and social event. Additionally we hope the new member will attend the Fireside, perform a speaking role at a meeting and be involved in a youth activity.

Greg Martin brought Allan in and Greg promised that in no time most of Allan's friends would be Rotary – and they are! Our Club has a goal to bring in 10 – 12 new members annually and to keep 8 – 10 of those. Other Clubs bring in 12 -16 new members but keep 4 of them on average. We have the best retention in the district. Transfers are treated the same as above – but they do not have the pay the initiation fee. **Bruce MacDonald** said 'do not invite a friend to join Rotary unless you have had lunch with them! The point he is making is make sure you know the person and that they are a fit for our Club. It is your responsibility to bring in new members!! Allan finished by saying if anyone is sitting at the same table as last meeting they owe \$2!

President Ken commented that if we want to continue to be as vibrant as we have been we need to sustain our membership. Sponsors and Mentors of new members are most important people that we call upon if we see the new member is not attending or engaged. There are 2 times where the new member seem to wander in interest: 1) one year in and after 5 years.


