1. I get asked to apply make-up's that are not in policy. Here is the policy (this is in your Handbook) so we are all on the same page:

Missed Meeting Makeup Opportunities

The Board has approved the following activities which are "Authorized Club Service Projects". Attendance credit (makeup) will be granted to members, on request, for participation in fund raising and service activities at which a member is requested to spend at least one hour of their time to participate completely. Make-ups may be "banked" as long as they are used during the same Rotary Year in which they were earned. By way of an example: if you earn a makeup in November 2019, the makeup must be used by June 30, 2020.

The onus is on the Member to notify the Club Administrator as soon as possible if you have a makeup available to be utilized for a missed meeting. Authorized makeup activities include but are not limited to:

- Attendance at a regular meeting of any other Rotary Club in the world. Make up meetings and out of town meetings are to be submitted to the Administer.
- Attendance at any RI convention, council, or meeting convened with the approval of the RI board of directors or the RI President.
- Attendance at any District conference, assembly, or meeting held by direction of the District Governor.
- "Hands On" Community Service Projects such as Salvation Army Kettle Campaign, Food Bank shifts, Feed the Hungry, etc.
- "Hands On" World Community Service Projects
- "Hands On" St. Mary's High School Partnership (mentoring, judging Four-Way Speech Contest, etc.)
- RYPEN/RYLA Conference participation
- Participation in the Student Exchange conference and district meetings
- Major Club committee meetings, e.g., Dream Home, Stay- in-School, Small Grants, Large Grants, World Community Service, etc.
- Dream Home Project participation 8 shifts worked allow 2 makeups
- Casino participation
- Other activities approved by the Board as specific requests that are made prior to the event.
- Club Board Meetings
- Members of the Bulletin Committee receive a one meeting credit for writing each bulletin.

Committee chairs are responsible for contacting the Administrator to ensure credits are given for Member participation in committee meetings.
