Diane Field from the U of C Senate came up to introduce our guest speaker Dr Ed McCauley, President & Vice Chancellor U of C. Diane gave a very lovely introduction of Dr McCauley.

Dr. Ed McCauley, President and Vice Chancellor of the University of Calgary, highlighted the university's growth and impact. Established in 1966, the university now has five campuses, 14 faculties, and 38,000 students, including 30,000 undergraduates and 8,000 graduate students. The annual budget exceeds \$1.7 billion. McCauley emphasized the university's top-tier teaching quality, significant research contributions, and high job placement rates for graduates. He also discussed challenges, such as the need to expand enrolment to meet future demand and the importance of attracting and retaining local talent. Elevating awareness of the organization, communicating a clear and compelling narrative about the organization's leadership in empowering youth to find and build their communities. Building capacity to be an organization that is resilient, sustainable and able to respond to opportunities and challenges.
- **Umoja Community Mosaic** building community to successfully create a sense of inclusion and belonging for newcomers to Canada and other marginalized Calgarians through soccer and basketball. They have programs in all 4 quadrants of the city and the program has now been expanded to include girls.
