SPEAKER: ALEX BAUM: THE GREAT TRAIL PROJECT

SPEAKER INTRODUCTION: MYRNA DUBE-THOMPSON: I am amazed at the entrepreneurial spirit that exists in the Calgary area; People who will embrace a new idea and make it happen. That idea must be well thought out, have a realistic development plan and have a strong leadership group. People will buy into it and support it.

I've experienced when Rotary becomes a partner in an initiative the support multiplies. In many of the new big idea projects that become reality in this community, Rotary brings huge credibility even by virtue of having its name attached, Rotary adds financial support, volunteer assistance and contributes to the successful realization. There are so many wonderful examples of this in District 5360. The Rotary/Mattamy Greenway is a prime example.



What you are about to hear today could never have progressed from the new idea it was a few short years ago to where it is today without the leadership of **Alex Baum**, **and the Rotary Club of Cochrane**. Alex, the project leader is a community builder well known in the Cochrane area and in District 5360. He has an innate ability to build associations and partnerships with diverse groups to continually move an initiative forward. And that initiative is The Great Trail.

Alex has been working with Treaty 7 peoples, other landowners and communities for many years to lay the ground work for this mega project, which has recently been called by a media source – a runaway train! The last I'll say is they now have a very comprehensive strategic framework in place. And I'm proud to be part of a steering committee along with other Rotarians – Dan Doherty and members of Cochrane Rotary, Cochrane officials including the Mayor, Member of Parliament, and representatives from Treaty 7 Nation, as well as several trail officials.

I asked Alex for a short bio, he said the last one he had, identified him as an apprenticeship mechanic who was lucky to have found Cyndie. I agree with the Cyndie part. Cyndie is Dr. Cyndie and a lecturer at U of C. And Alex is a very astute and successful businessman. A car guy, he is very much at home in this Club and has an impressive automotive career.

- Started out his career as an apprentice mechanic with a dream to one day be a licensed mechanic and ultimately if all the stars aligned, be a Franchised Automobile Dealer.

SPEAKER: Alex started by saying that our Club has raised the high-water level for lunches and notes that his President is present to see it as well! In the theme of Chinese New Year – he is delighted to be our Honorary Monkey for the day! Back in the early 1980's Alex was invited to our New Members Auction evening when Ed Whalen was still with us and he went home with a bird house (but, it never really worked)!

The Trail is a continuation of the Canada Trail. Rotarians are known for their support of parks programs throughout the globe. A survey was completed with Rotarians about what is most important to them and 'making a positive impact inn the community' was #1 as well Rotarians also rated #1 for 'providing grants for projects for my community'.

A humanitarian is described as a person who cares about people and who often participates in charity or does good work to show that they care. As we all know, in 2022 humanitarian response is really important.



Almost a decade ago Rotary helped raise money for the Glenbow Trail and then Rotarians came together for the Rotary Mattamy Trail. The Ranch trails is 95% done – just need to finish the Haskayne Park connection. The challenge here is that there are not any roads to the park and so it is very challenging and costly to find a solution. We are working on it – more to come!

Albertans and all visitors will enjoy all the trails we have worked so hard on. We hope to bring the trail to come to Cochrane – this we call stage 1. Many years ago, Cochrane Rotary and Lions came together and so far, we have returned \$4.1M to the community! We would like to grow the trail so that the full trail can be there for families to enjoy.

Stage 2 will be connecting communities through Stoney Nakoda – talks are already occurring.

A huge thank you to the Richardson family for all of their financial and emotional support for the Trail. The David Richardson Park is beautiful.

The goal is the have the Trail completed for June 8, 2025 to coincide with our 2025 Rotary Convention. Wouldn't it be wonderful to have the ribbon cutting at the time of the Convention? We work on these projects because we are Rotarians, we care and the projects last beyond our lifetime. There is a lot of work to be done and we are hoping you will help with naming the trail and be part of this exciting project! Thanks again for inviting me – I look forward to hearing from you all!

One of Larry's many treasured traditions was to provide all of us with the Chinese New Year Red Envelope. You each have one at your place. Allow me to briefly explain why it was important to Larry.

The envelope is red because red is a symbol of prosperity and wealth in Chinese culture. The money in it is called "lucky money". In China, the amount can range from one to a few thousand Chinese Renminbi. Hmmm....ok, so I had to break a tiny bit with tradition. Sorry, you don't have a few thousand Chinese Renminbi in your envelope. But you do have a Canadian Loonie!

In Chinese tradition, the **red envelope** is usually given by an adult to young children during the New Year days. It is believed that the money in the red envelope will suppress the evil from the children, will keep them healthy, and give them a long life.
