Calgary in the new convention centre. A little trivia and history on the event:

1910 – was the first Rotary Convention held in the Congress Hotel in Chicago, and Chaired by Paul Harris.

There were 60 delegates

1996 – was the last time Calgary hosted the event, and our Club's own Gardie Shaw was the District

Governor. Curiously, the 1996 proceedings appear to be the only ones not on the RI website. Must have

been quite the party.

2004 - convention in Osaka Japan is on the record of having the largest amount of paid attendees -

45,381. We will learn a little later if we plan to beat that number.

Main Presentation

Speaker Introduction:

Jim Fitzowich introduction of Mark Starratt and Craig Stokke.

Jim introduced **Craig Stokke** as someone who really needs no introduction. Craig joined Rotary in 2008, is Past President and still serving on the board. Jim thanked Craig for paving the way for Jim's presidency as well.

Mark Starratt is both a Past President and a Past District Governor (PDG). Mark joined Rotary in 1997, was President of the Crowchild Club in 1999 and PDG in 2008/2009. Jim got to know Mark during their board positions on the CRCF.

Main Speakers: Mark Starratt and Craig Stokke, "Rotary International Convention 2025"

Craig and Mark gave an excellent update on the upcoming Rotary International Convention that will be held in Calgary June 21-25, 2025. Rotary International advises that the convention typically draws 15,000 to 22,000 attendees in North American locations. Our hope is that the convention will draw 20,000 to 40,000 people from more than 100 countries around the world. The newly renovated BMO Convention Centre and the Scotiabank Saddledome will be key venues for the event.

The idea to host the convention came to **Craig Stokke** while he and his family were vacationing in Rome in 2015. Craig attended a Rotary meeting in Rome and ran into a Rotarian who said that the Calgary Rotary International Convention in 1996 was the best they'd ever attended! So Craig thought, "Why doesn't Calgary host the event again?", and that set the wheels in motion! After lots of legwork, applications and meetings led by Craig and Mark through 2015-2017, Calgary was selected as the host city of the 2025 Rotary International Convention on October 10, 2017.



Main Presentation: Main Speakers: Mark Starratt and Craig Stokke, "Rotary International Convention 2025"

Craig outlined the roles and responsibilities during the convention. Rotary International (RI) is responsible for housing, transportation, and everything that happens inside the BMO Convention Centre and the Scotiabank Saddledome. They also promote the event to Rotarians world-wide. The Host Organizing Committee (HOC) and local Rotary Clubs are responsible for everything else that happens in the community (most everything outside the main venues). It is **our** job to make sure the "Calgary Experience" is one to remember.

Craig and Mark are now building out the core of the Host Organizing Committee. Luanne Whitmarsh is going to be the secretary for the event! Everyone will have an opportunity to participate, as LOTS of help will be needed. This is a District 5360 Convention. All Clubs and all Rotarians throughout the District will be included in planning and execution, and all clubs will benefit from the convention. Expertise and leadership are needed from Rotarians and non-Rotarians in so many areas like transportation, hospitality, events, sponsorship, media and marketing, etc. Please contact Luanne Whitmarsh if you are interested in volunteering!

Craig and Mark emphasized that "we are committed to the BEST EVER Rotary International Convention!" The goal is to leave our community a better place and make Rotary a stronger organization as a result of hosting the convention. It will be a great opportunity to raise awareness about Calgary as a tourist destination, and to educate the entire community about all the great things that Rotary is involved in.

Some keys to a successful event are that it has to be something special, and that it has to be an unforgettable/wonderful experience, much like the 1996 Calgary convention was. The Executive has allocated \$500 from last year's Christmas Tree winnings to Kingdom Outreach. This charity shares a cup of coffee and a hot meal every Saturday morning to those who are struggling with addiction and homelessness. They also own and run Kingdom Coffee (4095 Ogden Road SE). A portion of the sale of every bag of their coffee (it is sold in their coffee shop as well as Safeway) goes to the outreach program, not only serving coffee but providing hygiene products as well as clothing.

We made 10 hygiene kits (5 for men and 5 for women). Each kit had 2 pairs of hand warmers, pkg of Kleenex, body wash, mouthwash, deodorant, pkg of adult wipes, toothpaste, toothbrush, nail clipper set, pkgs of Band-Aids, mini-hand lotion, lypsyl and a pocket hug.

We also donated extra hygiene products, 5 pairs polar fleece gloves, 6 pairs heavy women's socks, 6 pairs heavy men's socks, 9 toques and 9 neck warmers. They are always collecting new or used winter jackets and boots; new socks, gloves, toques, underwear and long underwear.
