I want all of the committee members in attendance to stand. They have been a big part of the five meetings we have held to date and I am very proud of all of their input.

Special thanks to **President-Elect Ron Prokosch** for the countless extra time spent putting this program together for our presentation today. We could not have done this without him.

I also want to stress that this program is just an outline at this stage and all of it is suggestions only, so please feel free to offer additional ideas in order to improve the product. This is clearly a work in progress. Now let me turn this over to **Ron** and thank you for your attention.

The Bulletin will provide a precis of some of the points presented, but everybody is urged to view the detailed presentation. Double clicking on the Excel logo at the bottom of some slides provides even further detail.

The Strategic Planning Committee has been working on the Plan for 6 months and is bringing forward this preliminary view for discussion and input from members.

A Strategic Plan focuses the use of resources, time, and effort in the same direction, and provides a road map for the next few years for the organization or for individual committees. It addresses a number of questions





Where are we now (SWOT)?

Strength: areas we do well or are advantageous to our Club. **Weakness:** challenges we face or areas for improvement. **Opportunities:** external factors that can help us achieve our mission and Vision. **Threats:** external potential problems or risks that we may face

• Where do we want to be 3 years from now? How do we get there? How do we measure our progress?

It is interesting to note that RI's Legislation Committee has recently passed a resolution that requires all clubs to establish a Strategic Planning Committee.

The recent District survey provided a lot of useful information on where Members think the Club is now and where it should be going. Over 42% of our Members replied to the survey, which is very high for a Club of our size. Our views on Club performance, personal engagement, spending levels in different areas, participation in various Rotary programs, fund raising activities and limitations were all solicited and are detailed in the presentation. Some interesting statistics were also shown: 60% of our Members are over 65, we only have 14% female Members, and in the last 4 years we have lost 9 Members (although our net gain for the 2017/18 year so far is 7, so the trend is positive). Some other key findings:

Strengths: we are good at fund raising and we have a lot of fun and fellowship. **Weaknesses**: retention of members, minimal opportunity for membership feedback to Club leadership, minimal influence on club operations. **Opportunities**: membership recruitment, join with smaller clubs to enhance combined fundraising and service delivery capability, extend partnership with The Calgary Stampede. **Threats:** relocation from Rotary House will be disruptive, ever increasing age of our membership.

I thought I would outline the procedure that we are using regarding membership. As you know, retention plays a big part in this area. Our attendance committee is chaired by **Charlie Gouldsborough**.

Their job is to track attendance with a view to retention not with a view to termination. They take their role as part of retention seriously and are doing their job with that in mind. If a mem-

ber's attendance is low by the standards we have then they will advise the sponsor and co-sponsor and will either approach the member to discuss the matter or the sponsor may choose to do that.

If there is then no change over a period of time the attendance committee can then again discuss the matter with the sponsor or with the member depending on the circumstances.

The sponsor can choose to be further involved but some will choose not to, and the attendance committee will defer to the mentorship committee. That committee is headed by **Allan Johnson**.

Their role is to find a mentor who will best suit the needs of the member in question. This process is a fluid process again depending on the circumstances. As you can see we take retention seriously, however, it does not always work.

When I announced on **January 4th** that four members had left two have actually been terminated for non-payment of dues and unacceptable attendance levels.

The recruiting committee is co-chaired by **Shellie Marshall and Murray Flegel**. Some of the things they are working on are longer tern and not designed to produce immediate results. The qualification and classes headed by **Roselyn Jack and Allan Johnson** deal with the prospective members who are introduced to them. They are not recruiters but can put forward a prospective member.

Our best recruiters are our members and so far you, the members, have done an outstanding job. All of our new people have been introduced by you to the members so my thanks to you and you know who you are.

We are net 7 which the district has brought in 100 new members and lost 157.

Dilan Perera has been a very active recruiter so Kudos to Dilan.

He has served as the Director of Member Services, Community Services, Club President and Assistant Governor.
