Speaker Introduction: Jim Hutchens informed us of the Scottish version of the "Battle of Alberta". The



on-going rivalry between Glasgow and Edinburgh. Naturally our featured speaker, our own David Young, came from the wrong side of Scotland. Most of the club knew that David was in the printshop business, and enjoyed acting in amateur theatre. When in fact he was an active Brewmaster, a business he worked in after leaving Scotland and coming to Canada for over 36 years. In his retirement David has developed a keen interest in the game of Pickle Ball.

Speaker: David Young chose as his topic the Universality of the celebration of Rabbie Burns. He provided us

with the historical context of Burns, the impact he had during his lifetime, and the volume of his creative efforts during his short life. He drew our attention to how the Scots have managed to have Burns Celebrations throughout the world.

David went on to quote many of the well know works of Burns and how their essential meanings are as relevant today as they were back in the 1790's.
