Paul Harris Education



When a member donates to their Paul Harris, it says in policy that our Club adds to the donation to make \$1,000.00. Here is the Board approved policy:
Fundraising: RI foundation
The Club utilizes their recognition points in its account at TRF to incentivize members to donate to TRF. The club will transfer points to club members as follows:
i. The Club will "top up" a member's donation to account for the difference between CAD and USD.
ii. Paul Harris: The Club will pay half of the cost of a PHF if the member pays the other half. This will also apply to Sustaining Members who are obtaining a PHF on instalment plans.
iii. Foundation recognition points are computed by TRF based on the
USD value of donations. For example, if a member makes a \$100 CAD
donation and the exchange rate is \$1CAD to \$0.80 USD the foundation
would award our member 80 points for a \$100 CAD donation. In this case of the club will transfer 20 points to our member to make it as if their
donation was made in USD.
iv. The Club will "match" the member's donation such that the Club
will transfer points equal to the total recognition points computed after
the "top up" has been considered. As noted in the previous example a \$100 CAD donation resulted in a total of 100 recognition points after "top
up" and the club will match those points with another 100 recognition points.
v. Annually only donations up to \$500 CAD per member are matched. vi. Only donations of members who have not attained PHF+8 status
will be matched as this is the maximum recognition an individual can obtain using points transfers.
