## **President Jim Fitzowich:**

Today we are going to recognize 3 of our own as recipients of the Queens Platinum Jubilee medal. Some important facts on Royal medals:

1887 – was the first Royal medal for Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee, following by the Diamond Jubilee medal in 1897.

1902 – Additional Royal medals were issued for Edward VII's coronation, followed by George V in 1911, his Jubilee in 1935, George VI coronation in 1937 and Queen Elizabeth's in 1953.

1967 – is when Canada started to issue medals on the Crown's behalf, starting with the Centennial medal, Queen's Silver Jubilee in 1977, Golden Jubilee in 2002, and Diamond Jubilee in 2012. Today is the Platinum Jubilee or 70th Anniversary.

# Main Presentation - Queen's Jubilee Medal Ceremony

**Speaker:** President **Jim Fitzowich** acted as MC for the ceremony.



On behalf of His Majesty the King and the province of Alberta, **Hugh Delaney, Norm Devitt** and **Glen Richardson** have each been awarded the Queen's Jubilee medal in recognition of their many years of public service to Calgary and the province of Alberta. There is an amazing 109 years of combined club service between these three special individuals, congratulations!

Good afternoon, honoured medal recipients, D.G. Steve Leavitt, guests, ladies and gentlemen. As the President of the Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park, I will be your Master of Ceremonies. I'd like to welcome all of you to this investiture ceremony for the Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee Medal.

Thank you for joining us to help celebrate Her late Majesty's Platinum Jubilee – and to recognize some exceptional Albertans. Today, we are gathered to pay tribute to those who have given of their time and talents in service to their communities, our province and our country.

As you know, Alberta's Platinum Jubilee Medal commemorates the 70th anniversary of Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's accession to the Throne as Queen of Canada upon the death of her father, King George VI, on February 6, 1952. Her late Majesty was crowned on June 2, 1953 during Her Coronation ceremony which was held at Westminster Abbey, as Coronations have been for 900 years. Steeped in this rich history, Her late Majesty's Coronation made history as the first ever to be televised and was watched by 27 million people in the UK alone and millions more around the world. And so, with Her late Majesty representing both the storied past of Britain, as well as the modern day world, she dedicated more than 70 remarkable years of continuous service to Canada, the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth. This extraordinary achievement made her Britain's longest-reigning and longest-lived monarch.

Her late Majesty expressed her wish that Jubilee events be an occasion for enjoying a sense of togetherness and optimism about the future which makes today the perfect opportunity to celebrate the achievements of people who make our community better. It also serves as a tribute to the example set by Her late Majesty throughout her extraordinary lifetime. Today's medal recipients lead rather than wait to be led. They tackle challenges head-on. They see problems as opportunities instead of obstacles. Congratulations to everyone receiving this special distinction. I now invite District Governor Steve Leavitt to deliver remarks and make medal presentations on behalf of his Majesty the King, in right of the Province of Alberta, and Rotary International.

#### D.G. Steve Leavitt's Remarks are delivered.

Before I begin, "In the spirit of reconciliation, we acknowledge that we live, work and play on the traditional territories of the Blackfoot Confederacy (Siksika, Kainai, Piikani) and the Tsuut'ina, the Ivaxe Nakoda Nations, the Metis Nation (Region 3) and all the people who make their homes in the Treaty 7 Region of Southern Alberta"

The committee that gives out these awards approached our Rotary districts and requested that at least 10 participants from Rotary be presented this award. Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park presented three names and we're here to honor them today. I can't imagine the amount of service these three men have given to this community, being people of action with service above self.

**Hugh Delaney, Norm Devitt** and **Todd Richardson** on behalf of **Glen Richardson** were called up individually by DG Steve Leavitt. They were presented with the Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee Medals by RCMP Corporal Marlies Dick (Hugh Delaney's daughter) and the accompanying certificate was presented by Steve Leavitt, for their outstanding service and citizenship.






# **Hiking Club**
