Main Presentation: Derek Beatty—Economic Forecast—BMO Analyst

Speaker Introduction: Stan Cichon introduction of Derek Beatty



"President Jim, Rotarians and guests,

From the time of the Babylonians, civilizations around the world have been celebrating the start of each New Year for at least four millennia. The celebrations usually involve food and reflections to rearrange your goals in life and work towards them. Your programme committee agrees and so today our speaker will leave us with some perspectives regarding a Financial Market Review & its outlook for 2023.

Now let me share a bit about the professional Derek Beatty.

As a senior investment counsellor for BMO, Derek works with families, businesses, First Nations, Foundations and Trusts to provide discretionary investment services to grow savings and wealth. He also works together with a wider team of wealth planning professionals with expertise in Banking, Trust & Estate, Tax, Insurance and business succession.

Academically, Derek holds an honors degree in Commerce from the University of Manitoba. He is a Fellow of the Canadian securities institute, holds the Personal Financial Planning designation and is a CFA charter holder. Folks, that allows him to place a lot of letters behind his name.

Derek has over 25 years of Industry experience, ranging from banking, managed investments, foreign exchange, fixed income, equities, and derivatives.

On a more personal note, he is originally from Assiniboia, SK, and Derek has lived throughout the prairies ... including Lethbridge, Winnipeg, Regina, and then Calgary in 2006. Derek spends his off-work time with his wife Danielle and their three daughters. If not at the rink for ringette (which only one daughter now plays), Derek is found working in the yard or enjoying a quiet time reading.

Main Speaker: Derek Beatty, BMO, "Financial Market Review and Outlook"

Derek gave an excellent overview of the financial market situation in 2022, and provided some insights into what to expect in 2023. Derek started off his presentation with "Why do economists hate weathermen? Because weathermen are more accurate than economists!" 2022 was bad by historical standards. The main reason 2022 was a bad year was because inflation took off, and central banks decided to lower inflation by rising interest rates. The general rule of thumb is that when interest rates go up, all asset prices fall in value. Both bonds and stocks underperformed and had negative returns in 2022. The FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index had a -11.69% return, while the MSCI World Equity Index had a -19.46% return. The S&P TSX Composite was down -8.66%. The only assets that were relatively positive last year were energy commodities, and energy related stocks, which helped the Canadian markets with their overweight exposure to energy.

The United States Federal Reserve position is to continue to raise interest rates in order to manage inflation back down to 2%. Commodity prices rose during 2022, but are currently off their 2022 highs. Derek loves to study financial history, and says that there is nothing going on today that does not have a parallel in the recent past.









Main Presentation:

Looking ahead to 2023, there are many variables to look at when making economic forecasts. Factors that cause the market to go up and down include: supply and demand, market indicators, confidence index, wars or other conflicts, concerns over inflation/deflation, government fiscal and monetary policy, technological changes, natural disasters or extreme weather events, corporate or government performance data, regulation or deregulation, level of trust in the financial sector and legal system. However, the only variable that really matters in the near-term is the trend in inflation. Geopolitical events like the war in the Ukraine do not really affect the financial markets so long as they stay contained to Ukraine and do not materially escalate. Inflation has been trending downwards over the past 6-12 weeks in both Canada and the US, which is a good sign.

The financial community did expect interest rates to rise coming out of covid, but no one anticipated the magnitude and speed of these interest rate increases, which resulted in negative returns in every quarter in 2022. BMO is optimistic that 2023 will be a better year than 2022. From an economic perspective things may not be much better, but the financial markets are forward looking and BMO thinks that the markets will have a good year as underlying economic stability will be there as 2023 unfolds. However, we will still have to deal with getting inflation under control with higher interest rates. We have become accustomed to a low interest rate environment but the world experienced very high interest rates in the 70's and 80's and we survived. BMO sees additional 0.5-1.0% interest rate hikes in Q1, 2023. This implies an additional 0.25% for the Bank of Canada, and an additional 0.75% for the US. These interest rate hikes are already priced into the market. Going forward, BMO sees rate cuts during 2024.

Economic activity is anticipated to slow in 2023. Both Canada and the US are expected to go into a recession in Q1/Q2, which is defined as two quarters with negative GDP growth. However, by Q3 there may be zero growth and Q4 should experience positive growth. There will be a continued housing correction in the real estate market in Canada and the US. Real estate tends to be the last asset impacted, as it takes about 6-12 months for interest rate hikes to work their way through the economy.

The Canadian dollar has experienced weakness, which is relative to the US dollar. During recessionary and uncertain periods, there is a global flight to safety in the US dollar, which drives up the US dollar relative to all other currencies, including Canada. However, as the world economy starts to pick up through 2023, money leaves the US and goes into other countries, which weakens the US dollar and which should result in a rebound for the Canadian dollar.

From an energy perspective, BMO expects 2023 WTI oil prices of US\$90 per barrel, reflecting an overall increase in demand of 1.1 million barrels/day. 2023 will be another year of volatile and high international gas prices which should translate into CAD\$4.85/mcf for natural gas at AECO.

Derek cautioned everyone that while economic and financial forecasts are important, it is only one component of creating a portfolio investment strategy. BMO still prefers a diversified portfolio of stocks and bonds, and believes that the stock market will outperform the bond market. This is all set against the geopolitical backdrop of everything that is going on in China, the Ukraine and the rest of the world, which can further impact economic outcomes.










PARTNERS in PRINT
