SPEAKER: DR. CHRISTINE LEPPARD

Speaker Intro: Sherry Austin: Christine Leppard earned a PhD in Canadian history from the U of C in 2014 and has worked as the Historical Specialist for the Calgary Stampede since. Dr. Leppard spearheads the Stampede's public history community engagement and manages the Stampede Collection & Archives.

She is an Adjunct Assistant Professor in History at the U of C providing hands-on public history opportunities to undergrad students. She is also on the board of directors of Heritage Calgary, currently serving as 2nd Vice Chair and chair of the Nominations committee.

Dr. Leppard has a Certificate in Museum Studies from the Alberta Museum's Association (AMA) and has been an adjudicator for the AMA's Recognized Museum program. She is a published historian and has presented her research in both public and academic forums nationally and internationally. Dr. Leppard is a passionate believer that engaging historical storytelling makes our community stronger.

Speaker: Dr. Christine Leppard provided us with a historical story of Stampede and we will be including her photos as part of the bulletin email for all of you to enjoy. We have recorded the meeting and the link will be available next week so that you can enjoy her story telling at your leisure.

Jantje (Janny) da Silva Curiel November 25, 1926 – July 7, 2021

On July 7, 2021, our beloved mother Janny passed away peacefully at the age of 94 with her family at her side. Janny is predeceased by her parents, her brother, her husband, Louis and her youngest son, Rene. She is survived by her children Jeannette (William), Louis Jr. "Luke" (Kathryn), and Yvonne (Shawn). She is also survived by five grandchildren, Trevor, Heather, Taylor, Alyssa and Ben all of whom brought great joy to her life.

Janny was born on November 25, 1926 to Bart and Jantje de Graaf in Menaldem (on the outskirts of Leeuwarden). The Netherlands. Her childhood was interrupted by World War II. During the war, her family endured many hardships including surviving by eating tulip bulbs.

Risking capture by the German army, the teenaged Janny bravely took food todowned allied airmen and members of the Dutch Resistance who were being hidden in the lumber yard of Leeuwarden.

After the war, in the summer of 1945, Janny was introduced to her future husband, Louis da Silva Curiel, by a mutual friend. Louis asked Janny if she would like to join him at a Pan American Airlines cocktail party and won her over with a gift of chocolate. Janny was training to be a dressmaker and sewingteacher at that time.

Janny and Louis were married in Leeuwarden on March 9, 1951. Electing to leave war-torn Europe and start a new life in Canada, they embarked on their honeymoon by sailing on the freighter Sypenberg to Baltimore, Maryland. From Baltimore, the newlyweds travelled by train to Calgary, where they were reunitedwith Louis' sister Mary, who had also moved to Canada after the war. At that time, Janny could not speak a word of English.

Janny and Louis stayed at the Hollandia hotel in downtown Calgary until they were able to find a place of their own. They met other Dutchies who helped thembecome established in Calgary. For the next few years, Janny cleaned houses andworked as a tailor/dressmaker/sewing teacher so that the couple could save money to purchase a house and start their own business. Louis and Janny started DaSilva World Travel Service Ltd on April 5, 1957. Janny supported their business by delivering airline tickets to their clients, eventhough she did not have a driver's license.

Janny and Louis proudly became Canadian citizens on May 28, 1957. Over thenext few years, they were blessed with the arrival of their four children. Jannycherished her role as a mother. The unexpected death of Louis Sr. in 1981 abruptly changed Janny's role from homemaker to businesswoman. Subsequently, with the help of family, friends, and trusted advisors, Janny developed into an astute businesswoman and entrepreneur. Janny enjoyed herbusiness career and retired only when she was in her early 80's.

Janny was a vibrant, selfless, generous woman who devoted herself to her familyand many friends. She retained a fierce devotion to her Friesian and Dutch heritage, and her raison d'etre was to ensure her home and any gathering of family or friends was always "gezellig" (cozy). Her love for music, nature, the outdoors and hiking was a prevailing force throughout her many years alive. Shewill be remembered most however, for her enjoyment of the simple pleasures of life, including her "lekker kopje tea".

Throughout her many years, Janny devoted much time and resources to numerous charities, including the CNIB, Adopt-A-Family, the Calgary FoodBank, and STARS ambulance.

Janny was a unique woman who loved and was loved by so many. She was notonly interesting, she was genuinely interested in everyone she met and has therefore touched the lives of so many. She will be fondly remembered and dearly missed.
