God said, "I need somebody willing to sit up all night with a newborn colt, and watch it die, then dry his eyes and say "maybe next year". I need somebody who can shape an ax handle from a persimmon sprout, shoe a horse with a hunk of car tire, who can make harness out of haywire, feed sacks and shoe scraps; who, in planting time and harvest season, will finish his forty-four hour week by Tuesday noon, and then paining from tractor back, put in another seventy-two hours"

Mr. Grey told us he was looking forward to the parade kicking off this Year's Stampede, with Parade Marshals Jann Arden and Paul Brandt. There is a good buzz around town, hotels are full, lottery presales sold out, and the new Enmax Park is now open.

**Mr. Connell** remarked on the long relationship between Calgary South and the Stampede and thanked all the volunteers who are the heart of the Stampede.

**Christian Orme**, Corporate Marketing Manager, AVI Homes, brought greetings and said how excited they are with their 21<sup>st</sup> Dream Home, a fantastic 1,833 sf bungalow, to be located in the new district of Harmony, just west of the city.
