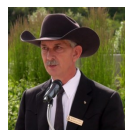
Welcome to the June 2nd, 2022 meeting of the Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park. I am the Club's President, Craig Stokke

As a native Calgarian, I am proud to have attended every Stampede since I was born. And like most of us, the Calgary Stampede has played a very important role in my life. And like most of us, I have incredible memories of the Stampede. I would like to share a few of those memories with you today.

- ◆ Before cell phones, I remember having to make arrangements to meet my parents at the clock tower on the grounds at a pre-set time, or you'd never find them.
- ◆ I remember when the Big 4 was a curling rink and a casino. I remember the wacky midway exhibits; buying tickets to see the "Dog Boy", the "Bearded Lady" or the "World's tallest woman". I remember eating too much cotton candy and drinking too much pop before going on the Monster. The people waiting in line probably remember that too. I don't go on spinning rides anymore.
- ◆ I remember the pride I felt standing centre stage on the final night of the Grandstand Show singing with all the former Young Canadians during their grand finale in the Young Canadians 25th anniversary celebration. The problem was I was never a Young Canadian, I was just a guy who got lost trying to find a beer. True story.
- ◆ I remember attending Stampede Wrestling and Rodeo Royale. I remember walking the parade route selling the Calgary Albertan newspaper. I remember walking the concourses at the Corral looking at all the pictures during Flames games and other shows. I remember the first time I entered the Saddledome. Wow! It was SO bright.
- ◆ I got my first job with the Stampede in 1985. I remember the uniform lady on the 4th floor of the Grandstand telling me how nice my blue polyester pants would "wash up"... and boy was she right!
- ◆ I remember the look on the faces of the Rotary International Convention site inspection team as we exited the Saddledome, looked down the stairs and were greeted by the Stampede Show Band, Stampede Royalty, and a trolley bus wrapped in Rotary colours. I was like "YES!!!" I can assure you the inspection team did not experience a welcome like that in Boston, Paris or Dubai.
- ◆ I remember attending harness racing at Stampede Park and trying to pick up betting tips in the concession lines and the bathroom.
- ◆ I remember passing pancakes through car windows in 2020 along with several other members of the Stampede Lotteries Committee.
- ◆ I remember phoning the winner of the Rotary Dream Home and the winner of the 50/50 to tell them their lives had changed forever. That was pretty cool.
- ◆ And speaking of phone calls, I remember receiving a phone call from **Warren Connell** thanking us for the very small part our convention played in pushing the BMO Centre expansion past the finish line. That was pretty cool too.
- ◆ And finally, I remember sitting in the Silver Slipper Saloon at the Westin Hotel reading the cardboard advertisement on the table. One side was promoting Motts Clamato Juice and the other side told the story of the Caesar and how it was invented in Calgary in 1969 by a gentleman named Walter Chell. So of course I did what seemed most logical at the time; I walked over to the nearest phone booth, looked Mr. Chell up in the phone book and called him at 2:00 in the morning. "Did you invent the Caesar?" When he said yes, I told him "I just drank 20 of them!"

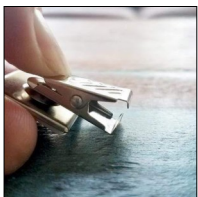

Speaker Introduction: John Fitzsimmons introduced our speakers for today. We are very happy to have members from the Calgary Stampede with us! First, Terry's son (Steve McDonough) (President and Chairman of the Board! Also joining us today is Joel Cowley (CEO) previously from Texas!

Speaker: Steve McDonough started by saying he always feels like he is in a room with friends at our Club. He is proud to be known as 'Terry's kid'!



Steve started at age 12 being a "carnie" and for all the years since he has been involved with the Stampede (although some of the specifics are fuzzy). The last 2 years have been rough. Like so many, the Calgary Stampede took a pounding. Year ending April 2020 had a \$26M loss and year ending April 2021 we had a \$8.5M loss. Layoffs and empty buildings were hard to handle. I knew that since I started as President and Chairman in January 2021 that things can only go up from here!

Also, we did a recruitment for a new CEO after the unfortunate passing of our previous CEO, Warren Connell. We were so pleased to have Joel joining us!

It has been busy – we are putting on a full Stampede!! The staff and 3,000 volunteers are back and ready! In March of this year at the 100 days until Stampede time, we decided that we would be having a full Stampede and the enthusiasm was magnificent! The phrase for this year is TOGETHER AGAIN. The Tarp Auction was a success this year – and we were proud to announce the partnership with Cowboy's Rangeland Derby! And, don't miss out on the Midway food – you have not lived until you have had macaroni and cheese ice cream!

We have a full grandstand program, diverse programming for the Coke Stage, Nashville North will be rocking, Blake Shelton will rock the Saddledome and the Cowboy Tent are going to be awesome. Additionally, Alberta Boot Company is an official partner for boots and hats – get yours now as they are already busy.

We really want to thank everyone; staff, volunteers, sponsors, City Hill, Province and Federal governments for their support and of course your Rotary Club and AVI. We have a new program in partnership with Immigrant Services called Stampede 101 for all new Calgarians to learn all about Stampede.

Calgarians know how to Stampede! It is in our DNA! **John Scott is the Honorary Parade Marshall** (A third-generation rancher, Scott is an instrumental member of the community and has been at the heart of the local film industry for over 50 years, showcasing southern Alberta on the big and small screens).

Kevin Costner will be our Parade Marshall (The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth and will be led by legendary actor, producer, director and musician Kevin Costner as this year's Parade Marshal. For over 35 years, Costner has been entertaining the world through his movies, television shows and music.)

Luanne Whitmarsh very kindly offered to help with any/all activities with Kevin and she REALLY believes Steve and Joel when they say 'they will call her to arrange it'!



Joel said that lots has happened since he and his wife moved to Calgary and are settled into a lovely home in Bearspaw. They feel very welcomed by all. His only concern is how darn slow our traffic speed limits are!

Speaker: Joel Cowley (Continued)

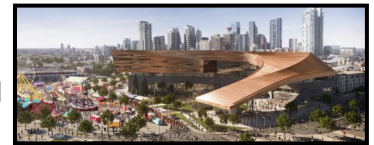
Joel said that all programs are planned, traditions are back. The Showcases, Competitions, Western Art, Rides, Food (even weird food), and a new ride Super Wheel which is 47 metre high and you can see forever in this ride!



Joel is very honored with the partnership the Stampede has with Treaty 7 membership. Elbow River Camp will be ready and he hopes we visit. He was very excited to announce that July 12-14 will be Pow Wow's in the Saddle dome. And, the rodeo is back and this year is a PRCA sanctioned rodeo meaning more acknowledgement of the skills of the athletes and Stampede. And, agriculture cannot be taken for granted. We are currently living in a time of food insecurity – so along with oil stability we need to ensure we have agriculture stability.



The BMO expansion has about 60% of the steel installed. When it is done it will be the largest facility in western Canada. I am proud to announced we are on-time and on-budget!



Speaker Thanks: Murray Flegel thanked Steve and Joel for a very interesting presentation. Steve – you started and lived through the pandemic; well done! And Joel – great to have you here as Texas is also a great rodeo state. For you both, your expertise, vision and drive have brought the Stampede through a very challenging 2 years and we want you to know that our Rotary Club is 100% in support of you!



In Closing: President Stokke:

Joel & Steve, thank you for taking the time to visit us today. In my opening address I mentioned some of my many memories of the Stampede. Like everyone here, I could have told a thousand stories and I have no doubt the future will bring another thousand stories.

Thank you both so much for everything you do to help create these lasting memories. The Stampede is such an important part of our city and it doesn't happen without amazing leadership, so thank you. In recognition of your time today, our Club will make a \$100 donation to the Calgary Rotary Clubs Foundation. This gift will help support our community. Thank you.

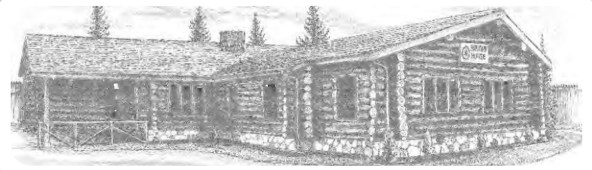

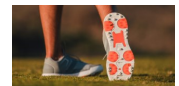

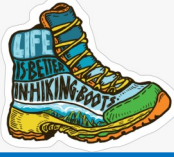
