

YEX PRESENTATION: KAYLEE QUINNEY




Dorothea Schaab introduced Kaylee Quinney today: Kaylee Quinney was selected in November of 2018 to be our Youth Exchange Outbound student for this current Rotary year. She left at the end of August 2019 for Spain and the Rotary Club of Vigo in District 2201. Due to our worldwide pandemic, her exchange ended early and she returned home early in March.

Kaylee is the third generation of her family involved in Rotary. She follows her father Maury Quinney, who is past president of the Rotary Club of Chestermere, and her grandfather Bill Quinney, who is a 30+ year member of the Rotary Club of Calgary West. Perhaps one day, Kaylee will also lead a Rotary club. Kaylee`s family includes her parents, Maury and Shannon and two sisters: Tara and Alexis and they live in Chestermere.

In September, Kaylee will be entering Grade 12 at St. Gabriel the Archangel in Chestermere. And then she hopes to study kinesiology at the University of Calgary (Benno, please take note) with her second choice the

University of Alberta. Kaylee is a strong leader and mentor to those around her, she is eager to embrace new experiences and learning opportunities. As an example she has earned a First Degree Black belt in Tae Kwan Do and instructed classes in this sport. She also loves to play basketball and badminton, as well as using her artistic talents, painting.



I want to express my appreciation to Kaylee's outbound counsellor Kathy Demorest for your support of Kaylee during her 3 year exchange program. So Kaylee had five goals that she wanted to accomplish during her exchange in Spain: 1) make five new friends; 2) become fluent in Spanish; 3) visit five cathedrals; 4) visit five museums; and 5) take many photos. Kaylee, I look forward to hearing if you were able to complete these goals with your shortened exchange.

Kaylee began by saying that she had a long 2 day journey to reach Vigo, Spain and was initially exhausted and overwhelmed. She had a lovely welcome for her host family. Within a few days was on the ocean in the family boat. She often walked and enjoyed seeing the ocean every day.

Despite her shortened time in Spain due to the pandemic, Kaylee managed to pack in a number of trips, and experiences. She reached many of her five goals: she made a number of friends, saw a number of cathedrals, visited a number of museums and took many beautiful photos. The only goal she fell short of was becoming fluent in Spanish due to her short time there. However she continued to study online when she returned home.

She visited a number of places, including Cies Island (renowned for their beaches), Santiago (the end of a famous pilgrimage route), Madrid with beautiful buildings and a McDonald's, Coruna with many cathedrals, Portugal

with outstanding architecture, and finally 10 days in Burgos with many cathedrals and an exciting professional basketball game.

Kaylee did attend school and went to classes to become more fluent in Spanish. Some of the teachers spoke English so this was helpful as she learned to better follow the rapid speakers. Kaylee also participated on a basketball team through a private club and made a number of friends there as well.

Cooking was part of the cultural experience and Kaylee especially enjoyed a potato onion pie (Tortilla) which the Host family made but she hasn't quite mastered at home. She also enjoyed their famous Spanish ham (jamon). Kaylee shared some Canadian dishes, including



lasagna, pancakes and lemon pie without the meringue. Kaylee also recalled the first Rotary dinner at a 5 star restaurant which served octopus and baby eels. She tried everything but it was a bit of an eye opener for her.

Her favourite time was around the Christmas season when Vigo was lit up with lights and celebrations included Christmas with extended family of her Host family, New Years with another large dinner and meeting more of the extended family and Three Kings Day on January 6 where you go out and enjoy the Spanish culture.

Kaylee also described the "Quarantine time" where Spain increased the restrictions and families remained at home. Kaylee said they managed very well with 7 in the home, playing cards and doing difficult puzzles.

Sadly it was necessary for Kaylee to return to Canada, cutting her trip short by many months. The trip home went smoothly and she was glad to be home with her family. Currently she is being kept busy with her job. She concluded by thanking the Club for sponsoring her on the exchange.

Rick Jakubec thanked Kaylee for sharing her experiences with us. He recalled interviewing her for the exchange and that she stood out from the other candidates. He thanked her for being a wonderful Ambassador for our Club and Country.

President Chas added his thanks to Kaylee commenting that she managed to pack in a lot in her shortened time in Spain.






