This week's program is a presentation on "Prostate Cancer in Perspective". I offer no comments on today's topic, other than to state the only one with perspective during a prostate exam is the Doctor. I do have some June 6th history that might be topical to our club:

5:30am – on June 6th 1944, 121 ships of the Royal Canadian Navy and 230 bombers of the Royal Canadian Airforce start their bombardment of Juno Beach, Normandy France.

7:30am – the 1st Canadian Army starts its amphibious invasion of June Beach, joined by the British to the east (Sword & Gold beach) and the Americans to the West (Omaha & Utah). British PM Winston Churchill personally chose the name for Juno beach, mindful of the Canadian sacrifice at Dieppe in 1942.

914 – Is the number of Canadian dead and wounded after the 1st day. The Queens, Winnipeg and Regina Rifle regiments took the worst of it. The Canadians advance the farthest into France of all the allied armies that first day.

24 – Is the number of Charter members of our Club that were WWII veterans, out of an eventual honour roll of 45 veterans. They served in the Normandy, Sicily, Battle of Britain and Battle of the Atlantic campaigns. As an aside, the original anthem language "in all our sons" command was put there to recognize WWI veterans...
