

UKRAINE DONATIONS: Don Taylor:

If you are looking for a good way to support Ukraine in its humanitarian needs, the World Service Committee has identified what it believes to be an excellent way to do so. Approximately 2 weeks ago the Rotary Club of Lviv in Ukraine formed an alliance with the Rotary Club in Warsaw and 2 in Germany to supply medical supplies and equipment to the hospitals in Lviv.



The Lviv Rotarians receive lists of what is growing critically short in the hospitals which they forward to the partner clubs. In Germany, a Rotarian medical doctor in Germany is using the collected funds to purchase the medical supplies and medicines required. A member of the Warsaw club is handling the deliveries of aid from Germany and Poland to her warehouse in Przemysl, Poland near the border. Their partner, a Ukrainian NGO is handling customs and delivery from the border to Lviv.

Inside Lviv, the Rotarians there are handling the receipt, sorting and delivery to the donations. The bank accounts are in the Warsaw Rotary accounts to avoid any administrative work in the Ukraine. This is just an excellent way to give. It is local from the get-go so no administration fee or delays once the money is donated. All run by Rotarians. The WCS committee of our club will be putting in \$10,000 of its budget toward this. If you would like to contribute, no amount is too small (or large) to add to our \$10,000.

If so inclined, **please make your cheque out to Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park and write a note at bottom – Charity Account for Ukraine Aid**. A Tax Receipt will be issued. This will be held open for approximately the next 2 weeks and we will have a spot at our next meeting or 2 to answer questions. You may give a cheque to **myself, Brenda McKinley, Ted Stack or Bob Wiens**. Thank you to **Bob Wiens** for finding this opportunity through Rotary Action Groups.

President Craig: Thank you Don. It is so terribly sad what is happening in Ukraine. Next week we will be announcing some exciting news regarding a Club initiative led by one of our amazing members.
