Shellie Marshall began by saying that It is my pleasure to introduce you to Koleya Karringten. Koleya is the Cofounder and CEO of Bitquest Corporation a bitcoin and blockchian educational company and Absolute Combustion International, a clean energy Tech company.

I met Koleya last year through Lorne Patterson, her VP Business Development, Lorne and I have known each other for over 25 years. I was keen to learn more when he spoke of blockchain and bitcoin and the exciting things happening in that space... when he introduced me to Koleya, the CEO of Bitquest, I was so impressed with her and excited for the knowledge that she is sharing and bringing to the public about blockchain and crypto currency - which she will be sharing with us today..

Kolyea has a contagious enthusiasm for tech, and what the future brings. She aims to educate and promote Alberta's tech sector in all she does. She has over 14 years of entrepreneurial experience with companies in mechanical and technological advancements.

She sits on the boards of Alberta Block-chain Consortium and Women in Block-chain and recently played a critical role in putting on the Alberta Blockchain and Technology Symposium - a technology conference developed to promote the tech sector in Alberta; where she combined government, venture capital and banking with blockchain, robotics, IoT as well a machine learning.

Beyond all of her credentials as a leader, educator and tech advocate. Koleya is a wife and mother of two sons.

Koleya comes to Rotary as an expert in the field of cryptocurrency after 14 years of experience in the tech world. She is the Co-founder and CEO of Absolute Combustion, The Bitcoin Rodeo and BitQuest Corp as well as the Executive Director of the Alberta Blockchain Consortium and cofounder of Women in Blockchain Alberta.

Her introduction to cryptocurrency and Bitcoin came when her mother posted an article about it online. Her interest piqued, she proceeded to research the subject and was initially disappointed in how many scammers she came across. However, her diligence paid off after several months of searching and research, and now she is a proud spokesperson and advocate for what she describes as the future of currency.

Koleya walked the room through the history of currency and made a case for the future coming full circle back to a backed currency that is protected from inflation and damaging influences.

She clarified that Bitcoin, unlike a lot of other cryptocurrencies, is not as risky or sketchy as its reputation may suggest, and that many legitimate brands (including ATB) have adopted it as a means of payment they accept.

Additional Notes:

- Bitcoins require a ton of energy to generate and as a result, are not something anyone would be able to feasibly hack, duplicate or steal
- There will only ever be 21 million coins in existence and it will take until after 2120 for the final Bitcoin to be mined.
- While Rotary is a bit of an exception, cash isn't as popular as it used to be and while there are no guarantees, digital currency is definitely going to be prominent and growing in influence over the next ten years.



- All transactions are trackable (despite the assumption that money can be hidden/laundered through Bitcoin)
- Bitcoin surpassed the value of gold in just 9 years since its creation Japan accepts bitcoin across the country as a payment method.

Like anything new, Bitcoin comes with its own risks and need for clarity, but we were all urged to learn more and consider its potential before dismissing it as something too "smoke-filled" to be viable.

A little over a year after bitcoin was created, the first real transaction was completed when someone traded 10,000 bitcoin for two pizzas. This is by far the most expensive pizza ever purchased, around 53 million at today's value.
