### **President Jim Fitzowich**

**45 B.C.** - Julius Caesar declares the equinox to be March 25 in his new calendar. Because of the Julian Calendars 11 minutes and 15 seconds/year error, the equinox was March 11 by 1500 A.D. before Europe switched to the modern Gregorian calendar.

#### New Member Induction: Max Feldman


**Dilan Perara:** Max was born and raised on a farm in southern Saskatchewan which Max's grandfather homesteaded and which Max and his extended family still own. Max is the proud father of his daughter Stephanie, who is graduating with a Masters in Social Work this spring. His lovely partner, Peta Glezerson is attending today's meeting also.

Max is an avid golfer as a member of Canyon Meadows and Stewart Creek courses. He has played in the SIS tournaments with me for the last 4 years!

Professionally, after earning a Mechanical Engineering degree and a MBA, Max had a 40+ year impressive career in the oil and gas industry. His career concluded as the Senior Vice President responsible for all TransCanada Pipelines (now TC Energy) natural gas pipelines in Canada and NE USA. This was a huge job with several hundred people and a multibillion-dollar amount of responsibility. Max and I worked in different buildings so did not meet for a long time – but, I knew him through his very positive reputation.

One of my responsibilities was executive development and succession planning. I remember several high potential engineers and geologists wanting to be transferred to Max's department, which caused me to check this out. I found out that he had a reputation for being an excellent leader and mentor and an all-around good man to work for. The staff knew that if they worked on Max's team, they would learn a lot and get promoted.

Post retirement, Max completed his ICD.D and took on several not-for-profit roles. He was involved with Calgary Performing Arts, Jewish Family Services and currently United Way 'Gain team' which assists NFP organizations in the area of governance, strategic planning and leadership. I know that Max lives our Rotary values and standards, and he will get involved with various projects within our Club and will definitely contribute a lot.

Both Loehr and Shorey were Rotarians for only a few years. They may have made the wrong committee choices!? However, Paul Harris, a lawyer, preserved until his death in 1947. I have to take a bow for the lawyers...

Max let me say a few words about this Club in particular. **Greg Smyth** said two weeks ago that this Club is extremely dynamic and energetic and so friendly. **Penny Leckie** has said that she joined because this Club really made things happen. I like to use the word awesome in looking at this Club. # **Stampede Foundation Presentation**

**Past President Sherry Austin** in conjunction with **Bob Brawn** introduced members of the Stampede Foundation. Welcome to our Stampede Foundation partners. We have three representatives with us today who will update us on developments on the Park, projects at the Foundation, and conclude with the status of our Legacy Project.

For our new members and guests, first a quick word about our Club's Legacy Projects. Our first Legacy Project was the building of Rotary House which our Club paid for over 8 years with proceeds from our first Dream Home contract.



Our current Legacy Project commenced in 2019. Usually, these projects are for a maximum of 1 million dollars over five years. Due to COVID and the cancellation of the Stampede and thus our Dream Home, thanks to the Stampede Foundation our project was extended for an additional year and will conclude in June 2024. Our Project is comprised of two components: the restoration of the old Oliver House and renovation into the "Rotary Learning"

Lab", an education centre for youth leadership, and the "Rotary Accessibility Fund", a funding source for youth who are unable to manage fees for Stampede programs and for children to access Stampede School and OH Ranch.

Our speakers will be: Bill Gray –Board Chair, Calgary Stampede Foundation, Sarah Hayes –Executive Director, Calgary Stampede Foundation and Ryan Hancock – Philanthropy Specialist, Calgary Stampede Foundation and Megan Berry (Administration and Stewardship Coordinator, Calgary Stampede Foundation) will also be joining us in a supporting role.

<u>Bill Gray</u> started by saying it is always great to be in Rotary House with our Club. He has had 4 months as Board Chair of the Foundation after volunteering for 35 years. He was also on the Stampede Board from 2015-16. We are working hard to make the Stampede Grounds a year-round meeting space. Thanks so much for all the partnership and work RCCSP does with Stampede and specifically those who have worked directly on our Boards.









# Stampede Foundation Presentation (continued)

A special note of remembrance to Roger Jarvis who passed in 2022. Although I did not get to meet him personally, I have always heard of his caring and commitment. As a note, when Roger passed he had left an insurance policy naming the Stampede (and if anyone of you wish to discuss this, I am available!).

RCCSP and the Stampede have a long and committed legacy of working together in good times and in hard times and we thank you for that. We are really looking forward to partnering with you all for the 2025 Rotary Convention – sounds like it will be a lot of fun!

Today is the AGM of the Stampede Foundation where shareholders come together now that we are 'out' of COVID. The 2022 Stampede made us nervous – would people come back after COVID – and they sure did! We had 1.2M guests and of course Kevin Costner (**Luanne Whitmarsh** really liked this point!). The expansion of the BMO is set to open June of 2024 and we are ON TIME AND ON BUDGET! When the BMO is finished we will have the second largest Tier 1 convention center in Canada! The Youth Campus provided 55,000 hours of programming and the Sam Centre will be complete in 2024.

<u>Sarah Hayes</u> said that the long journey she has had with RCCSP and the great friends she has made are with her through good and dark times. In 2022 the Foundation completed a new strategic plan – Return to excellence was the first goal. It is odd to say 'return to excellence' but after such turmoil with the pandemic there is work to be done. The second goal - Building our Vision, focuses on the infrastructure on ground. The youth campus, Rotary Learning Lab, Sam's Centre and more are all coming to fruition in 2023-2024. Some of our individual donors are in the room with us today and we are very grateful to you all.

Ryan Hancock said how happy he was here to add his thanks for our partnership over so many years. RCCSP is the most welcoming group he works with. Our Club has partnered in many projects over the years, and here are some of the projects in place today. Rotary Learning Lab, Access Fund and Band Camp. He shared a few quotes from appreciative family and participants that were heart felt.

He is a leader in the Education Department and his knowledge is most valuable with respect to our two-part Legacy Project.


We celebrate the legacy of James Wheeler Davidson by focusing on the impact of clean water and sanitation projects around the world.

On behalf of the Calgary Ukrainian Evacuee Welcome Committee UCC – APC, I would like to invite you to take part in a Hiring Fair for Ukrainian Evacuees.

As you are aware, many Ukrainians have been forced to flee their homeland because of the Russia violent unlawful invasions of Ukraine and the ongoing war. To date over 10,000 have arrived in Calgary. They have intentionally chosen Calgary because of job opportunities, the good cost of living, and a great quality of life. These professional and skilled laborer newcomers are hardworking, responsible, and well educated and are eager to secure employment. Our previous Job Fair in January 2023 was very successful. We had 30 employers and close to 900 Ukrainian evacuees attend, with over 150 job offers being extended. We expect that your participation in the April 21, 2023 Job Fair will be equally successful.

The Job Fair will take place at St. Stephen Protomartyr Ukrainian Catholic Church Hall (north entrance), 4903 45 Street SW, Calgary, between 9 am to 3 pm on Friday, April 21, 2023.

We invite interested employers to reserve a table to connect newcomers with job opportunities in your organization. Many individuals coming from Ukraine are arriving with very little and are looking for work immediately.

If you are interested in participating in the Job Fair, please email Mark Ewanchyna at UkraineSupport@protomartyr.ca before Friday, April 10, 2023 to reserve your table. Reservations are on a first come first served basis, and our last job fair booked up quickly. Please include details regarding your available positions and the qualifications required. Tables and chairs will be provided in addition to onsite volunteer translators. There is no cost to participants.
