
Rotary Employment Partnership—Inclusion Alberta

She welcomed the team from RI and said how excited she was to have the Convention in Calgary in 2025. Mayor Gondek said she has had a busy week of ALL ROTARY ALL THE TIME! The projected impact of the convention is for 17-25 (or 35) thousand Rotarians and families bringing in approximately \$54 Million in economic benefit.

White Hat Ceremony Continued:

Joe Connelly provided the history of Calgary's white hat ceremony:

The Smithbilt Legend: Smithbilt's founder, Morris Schumiatcher, was only 18 in 1910 when he convinced his father to move their large family to Canada from Russia. As a young and eager entrepreneur, Morris set out to build a successful business of his own, borrowing a loan from his local bank to purchase Calgary Hat Works. Smithbilt Hats was then born. Smithbilt



Hats concentrated on the local market and soon gained a reputation as the best hat manufacturer around. As Smithbilt produced mostly dress hats with small brims, these styles that flourished in the East and Europe. In 1926 however, Morris began a cooperative effort with local businessmen and the Stampede Board to promote western wear for spectators as well as partisans in the Calgary Stampede. The Stampede was providing a focus for local manufacturers who responded by developing products of western style. The Stampede started the buy local movement about 100 years ago! Increasingly Smithbilt made Western hats a specialty, and in 1946 Morris created the first white cowboy hat. He was very proud of the White Smithbilt, and indeed this small contribution to the Canadian identity became a symbol of the Stampede and of course Calgary.

The white Smithbilt, proudly work by local officials, was traditionally presented to visiting dignitaries and Royal guests. It is now known throughout North America and the rest of the world. As the years passed, the company continued to improve its products and presentation. The company's ownership passed to Morris's son Judal and then to the long-term employee Marshall Harvey. In 2003 the Harvey family passed the Smithbilt torch to a family friend.

The family of oilman Bill Herron debuted the 'White Hat' in the Stampede parade in 1947 and took the best-dressed prize with their matching black and white outfits, horses, saddles and bridles. Schumiatcher invested heavily in white felt after this auspicious debut and in 1948 became the first 'White Hat' Stampede. In that same year, the Calgary Stampeders won a chance to compete in Toronto against Ottawa for the highest honor in Canadian Football, the Grey Cup. Calgarians were so excited about the prospect of their home team playing in the Grey Cup that a group of prominent local citizens organized a special train to take fans to Toronto. 250 Stampeder fans donning the Smithbilt white hat, a chuckwagon, 12 horses and a host of entertainers headed to Toronto. Don Mackay, then Alderman, led the Calgary contingent in its high-spirited and much publicized event. The start of the tradition of the Grey Cub reverie was born when he rode a horse into the Royal York Hotel, a tradition that has continued each time Calgary is in the Grey Cup since!

The tradition of being presented with a White Hat was started by former Calgary Mayor Don Mackay. City officials in Calgary continue to give white cowboy hats as gives to visiting digni-

taries as the city's symbol of hospitality.

Today, the company is owned and operated by Cam Clark; a proud supporter of the Calgary Stampede. Dedicated to the preservation of western values and traditions, he is committed to moving the legendary Smithbilt name forward with an emphasis on quality and service.












Craig Stokke thanked the House Committee for being patient during a very busy week making their jobs a lot more complicated this week.

Bill Leclair: Today, I have the honour on behalf of the Club of recognizing not one, not two, but three major donations to CRCF.







Just last week we completed the acceptance of a major gift to CRFC from our deceased member Bill LeSourd. The new endowment is named the Bill and Betty LeSourd endowment. These funds will be available for our international projects if required. The Endowment was set up at \$2,005,033.94! Bill and Betty's children, Rob and Jean will come to a luncheon to coincide with the presentation of funds to a chosen charity. Specific donations to that Endowment can be made at any time as well. Two things Rob and Jean liked were the simplicity of the legal agreements and the low administration fees of Rotary which are less than half of one percent.

If you remember last week, I used the word awesome. It is absolutely awesome to recognize these major donations but more importantly and just think about this, to grasp that in a few years we will be receiving annual payments of \$500,000.00 from CRFC every year forever.

Neil Fraser, you did a tremendous amount of work in finalizing these donations. Well done my friend.

Craig Stokke introduced RIPN Stephanie Urchick.

Seriously, Craig said as a father of 2 young ladies and a husband he is proud of Stephanie's success of becoming the second female president of Rotary.

She welcomed us, people in the Rotary Family. She told us of her background (stuff that Craig had not already told!). 32 years ago, a friend invited her to a meeting, she loved it and the rest of the story is Rotary and Rotary in her life. She traveled to many countries observing projects; giving babies malaria medication in Mumbi and learning of a bio-water projects in several countries.


We celebrate the legacy of James Wheeler Davidson by focusing on the impact of clean water and sanitation projects around the world.
