Steve Mason had the honour of introducing two of our Club's greatest legends: **George Adam** and **Roger Jarvis**

George Adam and Roger Jarvis were both great leaders in the business community. George Adam has been in Rotary for sixty one years (Our very own Charter Member) and Roger Jarvis has been in Rotary for 40 years.

GEORGE ADAM

George Adam is a native born Calgarian who was seventeen when the war ended. George Adam went to University and became a Civil Engineer in 1949.

George took a position with Alberta Transit and then began a terrific career in the concrete industry.

George was a part of building bridges, schools, penitentiaries and also the Stampede Grandstand and the Saddledome.

George joined Rotary in Calgary in 1956 and Rotary was such an important part of his life.

George was Club President in 1968 to 1969. He was part of the creation of a program called Western Experience which began in 1986-87, where 17 year old students and exchange students from around the world learned about the western experience through horse back riding, Olympic Venues, The Rockies and the western lifestyle.

George's Rotary passion was the Waterton Peace Park Assembly and he has been to 40 out of 50 assemblies.

George's sage advice to those wanting to be Rotarians:

- ⇒ Sit with someone different each week
- ⇒ Do what you can handle, pick 2 or 3 committees and do that work well
- ⇒ Keep your attendance up
- ⇒ Fellowship is what keeps you in Rotary

ROGER JARVIS

Roger Jarvis was born on a Saskatchewan farm yet his aspirations were in the sky. He went to Saskatoon Tech and upon graduation went to work for CP Air. After 30 years of that Roger tapped into his entrepreneurial spirit and started his own travel company, Jarvis Travel.

Roger Jarvis wanted content employees so he started profit sharing with cash. Roger sold Jarvis Travel and Terry McDonough introduced him to the Stampede and Rotary. Roger was Stampede President in 2001, and had the FR-18's open the parade that year, he also then got to go for a ride in one. In 1993 to 2001 he served on the SAIT Aviation Advisory Board.

Roger's advice to everyone is to live your life by the Rotary Four Way Test.



George Adam thanked Steve Mason, Jamie Moorhouse and committee for putting of this together and George said that his will always be proud to be apart of Rotary and to Rotary Club of Calgary South.
