

This week's program is our annual Dream Home Kick-off. A few interesting items about the larger annual event we are part of:

1886 – The Calgary & District Agricultural Society holds its first fair.

1908 – Calgary hosts the Federally funded Dominion Exhibition and the City builds 6 Pavilions and a race track. A rodeo is held. The event draws 100,000 people. Calgary's population was 23,000 at the time.

1912 – Calgary's population is now 60,000 and American Cowboy and rodeo impresario convinces Pat Burns, A.E. Cross, A.J. McLean, George Lane to stake \$100,000 (\$2.7mm today) to organize the Calgary Stampede. They become known as the "Big Four".

2023 – On May 11 th at 12:15pm the Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park kicks off its annual Stampede Dream Home event. The rest will have to wait until 1pm....

b. Move for Polio Donation Challenge for highest per capita contributions to the Rotary Foundation Move for Polio.


DISCON was a wonderful weekend of friendship and learning. We all encourage you to attend next year in Drumheller (May 3 and 4).

the home builder since 1995. This years total prize is worth \$1.26 million, including \$125,000 cash, a \$5,000 Sobeys card, Insurance for a year, a playground set, and furniture. It will be in Range View Section 23 in SE Calgary. This is the first ever "Farm to Table" community. With our volunteers we are looking forward to a recordbreaking year."
