

# Today's Meeting: David Field introduced our guests, followed by the Welcome Song

Jim Hutchens pulled the fifty-fifty with help from our guest Shannon **Cormier**, where **Ken Copithorne** won the prize of \$185!

Gerry Darichuk provided a Ukrainian Relief update, highlighting that the power of Rotary has helped contribute to the success of the \$750,000 hospital which is now fully equipped and operational. This is only "the beginning of a lot more," as the success of this initiative has sparked further progress, with three additional fully funded hospitals now underway across Ukraine. **Gerry** is currently seeking volunteers to support the Ukrainian booth in the House of Friendship at the Rotary International Convention.





We had the opportunity to hear from one of our new members, **Peter Lafontaine**, a "Happy, Healthy, Wealthy (in that exact order)" businessman with a keen interest in tech and experience in the fur trading industry. Welcome to the club!

Kathy Demorest warmly welcomed our four Stay in School students, including Petra, a scholarship recipient who completed the program in 2011, and **Danielle**, who is



currently in her first year of college. Kathy also extended heartfelt thanks to the dedicated mentors, both past and present, whose guidance has made a lasting difference in the lives of these students. Lastly, welcomed president of the Alberta School Boards Marilyn Dennis.

Max Feldman introduced Peace, Able, Arshpreet and Ethan, the grade 8 students from St John XXIII and Sherwood who's in-school and community activities, hobbies, education and career goals stood out, allowing them the opportunity for the SIS scholarship. "We were impressed with all the students we interviewed, particularly, what they do to support their family, their school, and the community – all would be great Rotarians" - **Max**.

Kathy Demorest introduced Bryan Targett, the visionary who developed a plan to give students a meaningful opportunity for success, a plan that evolved into what we now know as the Stay in School program. Since its inception, the program has welcomed 42 students, helping to shape brighter futures through mentorship and support. **Kathy** then invited Sherwood Principal, **Breanna Fraser**, to the podium. Breanna spoke about the lasting impact of the scholarship and the inspiration it brings to students: "Someone who believes in them walks beside them and helps them stay on course. Thank you for believing in our students and making a lasting difference for their futures."

Shannon Cormier, Principal of St. John XXIII, spoke about the profound impact of the Stay in School program, not only through financial support but also through the value of mentorship. She emphasized that the program teaches students important life lessons, particularly the value of earning something rather than simply receiving it. The application process itself is a valuable learning experience, guiding students on how to write an application, request references, and meet submission deadlines. Most importantly, all applicants are given the opportunity to celebrate their hard work, regardless of the outcome.

Stan Cichon concluded by expressing heartfelt gratitude to Shannon and Breanna for their unwavering dedication to their students. He emphasized that thanks to programs like Stay in School, and to the people who care so deeply about our youth, we can look to the future with great hope and confidence.
