President Bill then wanted to provide some information regarding the Rotary House "Move" that may take place in the future.

#### Addressed in the August 3 Bulletin. Inaugural Address

"As many of you know, we will have to leave out current Rotary House within the next 3 years as space is needed for the  $17^{th}$  Avenue expansion and other Stampede projects. The Downtown Club is interested in sharing a new and large facility. I have established a committee that is working with both the Stampede and Downtown Club to look at our options for the future. It is the Rotary House / Stampede Liaison Committee. The committee reports to me and the Board. No decisions have been made as yet but will be at our first Board meeting. I will have an announcement for you following that meeting. Rather then let you have insight into the nature of the announcement, I will defer and let the Board deal with it first".

#### **August 21 Directors Meeting**

4.1 Future of Rotary House – Presentation by Rotary House/Stampede Liaison Committee – Sherry Austin, Murray Flegel and Allan Johnson – In addition to the three-committee member present; Bill LeClair, Ben Steblecki and Mark Ambrose are also members of this Committee. It is anticipated that Rotary House will be demolished in the next 2-4 years to accommodate the redevelopment of 17th Avenue. 2. Stampede officials are anxious to develop a stronger relationship with the Rotary Club of Calgary South; encouraging us to use Stampede facilities for more of our social events. The Committee has identified a series of action steps going forward including development of a Memorandum of Understanding.

Moved by Larry and Seconds by Jim: That the Rotary Club of Calgary South pursue a contract with the Calgary Stampede to relocate our Rotary Club to a new site on the main Stampede Grounds. This recommendation would take effect when our current Rotary House is demolished for the redevelopment of 17th Avenue. Carried.

#### January 4 Bulletin - Mid Term State of the Union Address Bulletin

Our Rotary House / Liaison Committee is looking at a number of things with the Stampede. As you are aware on August 24 the Board accepted a recommendation that the club pursue a Contract with the Calgary Stampede to relocate our Rotary House to a new site on the main Stampede grounds. Our committee is continuing to explore a new site location.

#### **May 15 Board of Directors Minutes**

**Proposed Motion:** That the Rotary House/Stampede Liaison Committee be authorized to submit a Letter of Intent to the Calgary Exhibition and Stampede expressing the Club's willingness to consider moving to the Blue Room as a permanent meeting place at the time of the demolition of Rotary House in the next two-five years. Our committee is comprised of Sherry Austin, Allan Johnson, Murray Flegel, Ben Steblecki and Mark Ambrose. The authorization to enter into a letter of intent regarding the Blue Room was approved by the Board on May 15. Our Committee has held a number of meetings with the Calgary Exhibition and Stampede. The decision regarding the Blue Room was made after looking at 4 possible sites which were Ranahan's, The Grandstand where we have met, the Heritage Room and the Blue Room. The Blue Room was the overwhelming choice. There was a recognition that we wanted to stay on Park and that Rotary House could not be moved.

The Committee will continue their great work, but I wanted to bring you up to date.
