

Stampede Lotteries Off-Park Sales: Dana Hunter provided an update on the new off-park sales initiative this year.

Goal: to develop incremental revenue for the lottery and the partner organizations by accessing buyers who would not otherwise visit the park and make a purchase.

Opportunities: We have 6 unique events committed for the 2023 event in cooperation with 3 other Stampede Committees, Parade, Downtown Attractions and On-Park Breakfasts.

What to expect: As these events will have you roaming and mingling you should be prepared to walk a fair distance. No shelters will be readily accessible so sunscreen and umbrellas should be in your event day kit. Water will be provided.

Shifts available:

<u>Parade</u> -Friday July 7, 2023 – Sales will take place during the pre-parade from 7:30 am to 9:00 AM, Sellers to arrive by 7:00 AM. Each sales team will be one Rotarian and one Kinsmen. You would be responsible for sales in a 4-block zone on the parade route. Aprons and Hi-vis vests will be made available. **We require 8 Volunteers.**

On Park Breakfasts - Sunday July 9 and Wednesday July 12, 2023 from 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM. Each Sales team will be one Rotarian and one Kinsmen. You would be responsible for making sales to the patrons awaiting and/or enjoying their breakfast. Aprons will be made available. **We require 4 volunteers for each date.**

Main Presentation - Stay in School

Stay in School (SIS) Program: Stan Cichon provided a review of the Stay in School program. 25 years ago some of the visionaries from our club conceived the concept of our Stay in School Program. One year later in 2001 this program was started under the watchful eye of then president **Bryan Targett.** And WOW it has been a phenomenal success.



Originally funded by our annual golf tournament it raised over 5 million dollars to create a lasting endowment for our students. The current scholarship now available is in the amount of \$32,000 per recipient payable to their post-secondary institute in increments of \$8,000 over 4 years. In addition each successful applicant receives a computer, printer and appropriate software. This year we had over 50 applicants which was shortlisted to 17 candidates interviewed. However the unsuccessful interviewed applicants each receive a reward of \$100.00. As a side note the Stay in School Golf Tournament has morphed into our Kids at Heart Golf Classic.

Some quick facts:

- To this date we have 70 students in our program and we will add 4 more today.
- Currently we have funded \$1.24 million
- Our success rate with our students is 93%... Yes, this is a WOW.

It is my belief as a professional educator this in no small way can be attributed to our successful Mentorship program.

In the evolution of our program today sets another bench mark. Under the Chairmanship of the late Bill Sumner we have moved from originally interviewing candidates in the 6th grade to now students in the 8th grade with the mentorship formally beginning in the 9th grade.

In our 22 year history there have been 3 chairs. The first was the godfather or should I say grandfather, **Bryan Targett.** He was followed by **Bill Sumner** as the second and I am truly humbled to be your third chair. Bill gave his heart and soul to Stay in School. In his detailed and exhaustive style I was well briefed and given two huge paper binders of instructions. God bless you Bill... Bill your legacy continues as your son Glen and his partner Kate both here today have agreed to be part of our Mentorship program.









Main Presentation - Stay in School

Terry Allen introduced the 2023 Scholarship Recipients from St. John 23rd School in Falconridge. These included:





Misgana Esayas attends Grade 8 at St. John 23rd School and is an excellent student, achieving high grades in all of her subjects at school. Her teachers comment that she has strong ethical and moral values and is very committed to her studies. She is a talented athlete, in particular she loves gymnastics and has won a gold medal in one of her recent competitions. She also participates in her church activities and is responsible for helping with family re-

sponsibilities at home. Misgana wants to go to university and study medicine.

Elijah Patacsil is in grade 8 at St. John 23rd school and has excellent grades in all of his subjects. He participates in the school programs helping out in Pep Rallies; as a Buddy for younger students and also plays in the school band. In his community he helps his neighbours as a Snow Angel and is active in his church. Elijah enjoys playing the piano and his piano teacher noted that he is quick learner and is very diligent. Elijah is interested in pursuing either a career in Music or Engineering.





Principal Shannon Cormier of St. John 23rd School provided some comments. She said the scholarship money is life changing, and described how their teacher, Ms. MacIssac set up classes to help these young students prepare applications. Stan Cichon also came to the school to talk about all of the philanthropic work that Rotarians are doing in the world, and hooked the kids on the concept that it's our job to take care of one another. This got the kids involved in volunteering within the school and the community, which

has been a great outcome. She was very grateful to Stan and the SIS program has come into their school and is looking forward to continuing to work with our club.

The 2023 Scholarship Recipients from Sherwood School in Ogden were then introduced by **Terry Allen**. These included:

Ayaan Mohamed Ali is in Grade 8 at Sherwood Jr. High School and has 3 siblings. Her family has come to Canada from Somalia and she has done well in school during the time that she has been here. Her teachers highly recommend her for this scholarship and comment that she is a thoughtful and dedicated student. She works very hard and wants to succeed. Ayaan is involved in school sports as well as volunteering at school events. She also volunteers at the Mosque and helps around the house. Ayaan wants to study to become a Radiologist.









Main Presentation - Stay in School



Owen King is in Grade 8 at Sherwood Jr. High School. Owen has shown excellent aptitude for his studies and teachers note that he is a very good student who demonstrates excellent leadership qualities. He plays volleyball and basketball in school. He volunteers at the YMCA and helps his mother in the home as much as possible. Owen aspires to become an Engineer.

Principal Dr. Karena Munroe of Sherwood School then provided some comments. She said that the school, established in 1957 in Ogden supports students and families with diverse backgrounds. She discussed the value in mentorship and the connection between families, teachers and community supporting a "learning to dream big." She also praised the Rotary scholarship money which is a commitment to develop the skills and gifts of worthy members of the next generation of leaders, given at an age young enough to really make a difference. This funding removes obstacles, represents belief in



the potential of an individual, and gives our deserving students the motivation and confidence to strive further for excellence.

Dr. Munroe knows these deserving students will use their education to make a difference in the lives of others. This annual commitment from our Rotary Club will support social change and enhance diversity in learning. With education, as Nelson Mandela said, we have our most powerful weapon for which to change the world! She thanked our Rotary Club for our support, our generosity and our belief in their students and their community.



Thank the Speaker: Hugh Delaney, the Stay in School Steering Committee Member Emeritus thanked the Stay In School committee for their efforts. The committee includes Bryan Targett, Terry Allen, Ted Rowsell, Paul Brick, Stan Cichon, Earl Huson, Rudy Roberto, Brett Albers and Kathy Demorest, all of whom worked many hours in order that we are able to recognize our four students here today.

"It is my firm belief that the success of our 20 plus year programme is in a major way due to the contributions of our mentors and our mentorship programme. Also, without the cooperation of our school Principals and their leadership this programme would not be possible. Shannon Cormier and Karena Munroe thank you for being on our team. 
