Dr Tim Rahilly, is the 10th President and first Vice-Chancellor of Mount Royal University, where he also serves as a Professor of Psychology. A strong believer in the transformative power of education, he provides inclusive and strategic leadership—working closely with both the campus and broader community to advance MRU's mission and contribute to Calgary's vibrancy. Tim is passionate about student-centred learning, mental and physical well-being, and preparing graduates who are both practical and critical thinkers. Over the past 25 years, he has held academic and administrative roles at institutions including Simon Fraser University, UBC, and McGill, and has published in the fields of international and higher education. He has served as President of both the Canadian Association of College and University Student Services and the Canadian University Survey Consortium and currently serves on several boards including the Katimavik Foundation. Among his many accolades, Dr. Rahilly received the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal in 2022 and was named a Compelling Calgarian by the Calgary Herald in 2020.

Please let Grayce know if you are planning to attend by June 12 so we have a count for refreshments.


