Doug Hood Classification Talk

Doug Hood grew up in Moose Jaw. After graduating from the University of Saskatchewan with a bachelor in commerce, He knew he didn't want a 9 to 5 job. He decided to go into sales with the London Life Insurance company starting his 45-year career in the financial services industry. Over these years he and his family lived where they worked, after some discussion with his family they decided to move to Calgary in 1999. Neither he nor his wife had spent much time here in Calgary before moving here but Calgary checked off all their boxes of what they wanted for their family. They say that this was the best decision they have ever made. Doug worked for a few different financial service companies here in Calgary but his final position before he semi-retired was National Director of business insurance planning for a major life insurance company. **Doug** still does a little bit of consulting and working with a few clients and is still an avid learner, Last year he completed his Masters's Designation in Philanthropy. He likes to keep his hand busy in terms of learning his trade even tho he isn't spending a lot of time doing it. When he moved to Calgary he was invited to join the Rotary by Pat Hutgson of the Chinook Club, at this point **Doug** knew he would not be able to attend lunch meetings so he was introduced to Walter Zook at the Rotary Club of Heritage Park, at the time this club was brand new. He had the opportunity to be the President of the Rotary Club of Heritage Park in 2012. In 2012 they started projects that were inclusive of all Calgary clubs—this year, they started the Rotary Remembrance Day Memorial which **Doug** is still very involved with 12 years later. He was on the board of directors of the Calgary Rotary Club Foundation for 6 years. After 24 years at RCCHP, he needed a refresh, a recommitment to Rotary, and something new and exciting. He believes he has found that here at the Rotary Club of Stampede Park.





Some of **Doug's** interests are most sporting events, especially baseball Ball cheering for the Blue Jays, Hockey cheering for the Flames, and Football cheering for the Stampeders. **Doug** is still actively Curling and Golfing! he is an avid reader of almost everything but mainly History and Historical fiction. **Doug** has a huge passion for Maya Archaeology, he has explored 30 sites in Mexico and Guatemala. In addition to that he is an avid amateur Genealogist. He was one of those people who took a DNA test and discovered he had a brother. **Doug** all wanted a brother and ended up getting on at age 65. His family tree is now over 50,000 people and he is in contact with many relatives all over the world. His greatest pride is his family. Doug and his

Courtney Wilson tells us about the Rotary Employment Program

The partnership between Rotary and Inclusion Alberta creates meaningful employment opportunities for individuals with intellectual disability. How it works is Rotarians use their networks to open doors for coordinators to have. conversation about inclusive hiring. Rotarians make the introduction with potential employers and then coordinators meet with potential employers to discuss their business needs and then match them with job seekers with intellectual disabilities who have the skill sets that are looking for. They offer employer support throughout the process of hiring and training and then come back to check-in.

Updates:

As of this month, the partnership has developed 830 jobs since it started in 2001. As this is a great number there is still an extreme need for more jobs for people with intellectual disabilities. The unemployment of these people with intellectual disabilities sits at about 80%.

To keep making these jobs we as Rotarians make that connection and start the conversation!





Marlene Doherty the District Chair for Polio Plus

Marlene Doherty shares helpful information on Polio how we can help and the help we have already provided.

She shares how important it is for us to help and how if we do not continue to help many children will end up paralyzed.

Donations are very low compared to past years. In 2022 we raised \$42,000 in 2023 we raised \$27,000 and this year we are currently sitting at \$1000.

Dr Booker manages the services and research activities in the animal agriculture business at Telus Agriculture and Consumer Goods.

Dr Booker talked about Innovation in animal agriculture and TELUS' philanthropic efforts. and Connecting data sources in agriculture and food production. 
