Hugh Delaney opened by thanking everyone for attending this important Celebration in our Rotary Year. He mentioned that today's attendance was just over 200, the largest in the 16 year history of the SIS Pro-



gram. He introduced Bill Sumner the current Chair.

Bill Sumner who took over from the long-time chair, Bryan Targett, acknowledged all the effort put in during the last year by the Committee. Over the years some 58 students have benefitted from the Program. We currently have 12 students attending Post-Secondary institutions and have had 10 graduates. The scholarship fund now has a balance of some \$3.5mm and is being capably managed by Richardson GMP.

He called on Mike Ankers to say a few words on behalf of Richardson GMP. Mike, who is the Director of National Sales, told us that his firm proudly carries on the tradition of the Richardson family ... "being involved in the Community and giving back". They particularly felt our SIS Program was a perfect fit and **Keith Bekker** has been involved right from the beginning.

He emphasized the importance of Education in instilling confidence in the students and was particularly keen on the Mentorship component. He felt that in this day and age of instant gratification that mentorship played even a larger role in focusing young people on investing in the future.

Bill gave a big thank you to this year's Selection Committee......Shellie Marshall, Carol Graham, Chloe Dusser, Stan Cichon, Jeff Hughes, Larry Koper and Sid Smith.

<u>President Ken</u> then joined Bill to say a special thanks to **Bryan Targett**. In Bryan's year as President, 2000, he was the leader in starting this Program. He

received a standing ovation and the Club donated \$500 to the Scholarship Fund in his name.

Bryan Targett thanked everyone who was involved over the years!

She knows that there have been lots of bumps, trials and tribulations along the way but Jennifer is with us today and we will all celebrate her success.

Jennifer Luckhardt started out with a big thank you to the Rotary Club for helping her to get where she is today. She really enjoys coming to these Lunches and seeing all the students. Her journey started at Falconridge, then Terry Fox, then James Fowler, then off to the University of Lethbridge followed by the University of Waterloo.

She comes from a family of 8 and when her mother pushed her into applying for the Rotary Scholarship she did not really know what she wanted to do but eventually followed through with an application and was successful. She made it with Rotary help and all the assistance along the way from Sherry. When she started we only had 4 from each school and she always labored with thoughts that "I did not really deserve this". She had said in her application that she wanted to be a teacher but admitted to a small lie! Not really a lie but she did not know what she wanted and changed direction numerous times. She told the students don't beat yourself up with self-doubt and if your marks drop, just don't get depressed.

She had to work at lots of jobs to see her way through University and moving around from place to place made it harder. She has her share of failures and quoted Winston Churchill "You never learn unless you have failed", but she is proud of the fact that she is the only one from a large family to go to University. She is now working in Broadcasting and does the subtitles we see on TV... she loves it, but is ambitious and expects it to lead to other opportunities.

She took some time to acknowledge all the various groups present in the room...

- ü Teachers. She bows to Teachers for the work they do.
- ü Mentors. They are your friend and part time Parent. But please Mentors be patient with the students if they sometimes have problems as they progress.
- ü Parents/Guardians. Students they are your biggest support and you need them to be with you.
- ü Siblings. Lots of honest support is required.
- ü Sponsors. You don't know how much you are changing a student's life.

And lastly to the Students..... Be strong, you will make mistakes, change your mind now and again but don't doubt yourself that you will make it. And in the words of Dan Poynter "Each Step you take reveals a new horizon. You have taken the first step today. Now, I challenge you to take another"




Activities include our traditional Friday evening mixer, with dinner on Saturday and lots more.
