This week's program is our annual St. Mary's 4-way speech contest. It is also the first meeting after the Victoria Day holiday on Monday. Some facts about the May 2-4 day:

1845 – the first Birthday holiday for Queen Victoria is held on May 24th in the then Province of Canada, it becomes the national holiday in 1901. It is always celebrated on the Monday just before May 25th.

1939 – Victoria Day is also celebrated as the King's birthday as George VI and Queen Elizabeth were touring Canada at the time. Previous to that, the Monarch's birthday was celebrated as a separate day, on the day.

1952 – The ascension of Queen Elizabeth II makes Victoria Day the Official Birthday celebration of our Monarch. Elizabeth's birthday was April 26th, 1926 and King Charles is November 14th, 1948.
