

Richard Gotfried was born and raised in Calgary, Richard served 2 terms as Member of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta for Calgary-Fish Creek. He served as Chair of the Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund and Vice Chair of the Standing Committee on Public Accounts, among several other Standing Committees. He was the provinces designated voting member of the Pacific Northwest Economic Region, serving as President in 2021/22. Richard was privileged to Chair Alberta's Facility Based Continuing Care Review Expert Panel which created the road map for continuing care system in Alberta. He currently serves as Chair of Alberta's Strategic Aviation Advisory Council, and is a Director of the Calgary Saddledome Foundation

Mr. Gotfried's career has also involved time with Hong Kong-based Cathay Pacific Airways during which time he built an enduring bond with Canada's Asian-Canadian communities. The Trico Group of Companies, during which time he created Calgary's first attainable home ownership program. Calgary Economic Development, Vice-President of Corporate and Community. On the volunteer front; Kids Cancer Care Foundation, GlobalFest, Chinatown Street Festival, the HK- Canada Business Association, Bow Valley Ranche and Friends of Fish Creek Societies. Richard holds an Executive Management certificate from the University of Hong Kong and studied political science and economics at the University of Calgary, while also completing an Executive Certificate in Corporate and Community Involvement from Boston College.


### **Hiking Club**
