This week's program is PP Bruce McDonald's Rotary profile. Today is also May 4 th which is Remembrance Day in the Netherlands, followed by Liberation Day on May 5 th , both days important to Canada and Canadians as well:

1943 – On January 19, Princess Margriet is born in an Ottawa hospital. Her father Prince Bernhard and mother Crown Princess Juliana were forced to flee the Netherlands in 1940 after the Nazi invasion. Juliana becomes Queen in 1948.

1944 – in September the 1 st Canadian Army starts the liberation of Netherlands – operation market garden. The campaign finally ends in April 1945, after the Dutch endure the hardships of the "hunger winter'. Canadian airborne aid drops saves 100's of thousands.

329 – thousand are lost during the liberation, including 7600 Canadian troops, the majority were Dutch civilians.

10,000 – Is the number of tulips the Netherlands sends to Ottawa every year to celebrate Liberation Day. You can see them along Dowse lake and the Rideau canal. I recommend it.

Main Presentation - Rotary Profile - Bruce MacDonald

Today's programme was to honor Past President Bruce McDonald with a "Rotary Profile."



Introduction. **Greg Martin** did a great job in introducing Bruce and providing many humorous stories of both Bruce and Lorraine and his time in the Club. The following is a summary of his remarks. Greg mentioned Bruce was about to be something great for the Club and his first clue was his Classification, Gas Bar Developer, they didn't know what that was at the time, stating that Classification would probably never be repeated and neither will Bruce. He touched on his ELECTRIC personality, comparing him to 110 Volts of electricity and continuing that Lorraine was 220 Volts and together they were 440 V which could charge 2 TESLAS at the same time.

We found out about Bruce's upbring in Saskatchewan, to his many moves, eventually finishing High School in Vancouver. He met Lorraine and remembers the first night out at Kerrisdale Arena to hear Little Richard (I remember them!). Married in 1961 and have 3 Boys and one Girl with 8 Grand Children. Worked for Gulf Oil in their Service Station business and moved to Calgary where he left them and managed his own. He started building Gas Bars that he leased back to Gulf. Rotary become a big part of his life when he was introduced to this club by Garth Nicol. Bruce went on to play an important part in this club over the years.



The Club gave him a hearty standing ovation.

Bruce's Comments. Following the Video Bruce told us that he was totally surprised by the number of people here today. Again you need to view his comments on line but it was highlighted with

- Rotary is a good place to be.
- It was a good life here in Rotary.
- Most of our friends are here in the Room.
- It is just like home.

He encouraged all to keep up their attendance, stay involved, and to get their spouse involved. He said that when he attended the Convention in Houston we kept saying this is the best Rotary Club in the World. We keep saying it but maybe we are the best given what we do in the Community each year. The Dream Home started small, but we thought big and with that and our other activities we are making contributions in excess of \$1,000,000 back to Community annually.



Al Johnson closed with more stories of Bruce and Lorraine and a heartfelt thanks. Al told stories of their curling trips and winning championships and how it was an honour to be his Skip. He then emphasized that Bruce was the best dressed man in the Club and one of the funniest Rotarians. We all agree!!




Rotary Partners Book Club for May 15th, 2023
