Today we paused to Remember and honour the Men and Woman who served and serve in the Armed Forces and those who paid the ultimate sacrifice for our freedoms. We met at the Carriage House Inn with other Rotary Clubs in District 5360. It was a great turn out and as always Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park was the largest represented Club there! This would not have been possible without the hard work **Greg Smyth** put in for the last few weeks. Greg did all the leg work for us to get everyone registered. Thanks Greg, you did an amazing job!



**Lt. Col. (Retired) Jim Hennessey** was our Guest Speaker and he blew us away with stories recited from memory, as he did his entire 40 minute presentation without a single note or pause. There weren't many dry eyes in the audience as we heard of the triumphs and losses of our great Country fighting overseas, from young men, some as young as 14 years old. Lt. Col. Hennessey even spoke of the Princess Patricia Canadian Light Infantry, with my Grandfather (Sarah Brown) was the General of during W.W.II. He spoke of the Victoria Cross award, which is the highest award within the Canadian honours system, and how it is usually granted to individuals for their extraordinary valour but the P.P.C.L.I. was the only troop to receive the award collectively!!! Such an amazing story and meant so much to me, thinking of my Grandfather, made me so proud! I have attached a photo of General G.G. Brown for reference, look at all of those medals! What a small world it is, I learned today that **Michael Zacharki** was the Chef to my Grandfather's troop!! I cannot wait to hear more about that from Michael.



Lastly, a Member of another Club told stories of her Father's experience in War, even reading old letters he sent his Wife while he was away. It was inspiring to hear what he had gone through yet was still able to make jokes in his letters. It was heart warming to see the Veterans in the room stand and get a standing ovation, including **Keith Davis** and **Michael Zacharki** from our Club. Thank you for your service! There was even a 98 year old Veteran with his Daughter in attendance. We got to hear the Honour Roll from each Club's President, hearing of all past and current Members who have served. We heard from D.G. Steve Levitt and Manon Mitchell, then we observed a moment of silence, heard Flounders Fields, The Last Post, and sang God Save the King for my first time, may her Majesty the former Queen rest in peace.

## Cleven Award

This special internal award of the Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park was established in 2006 to recognize the outstanding contribution of club members who take on significant responsibilities and commitments in furthering the work of our club.

The award is named the “Cleven Award” in honour of and recognition of Harry Cleven, first president of the Manchester Rotary Club 1955 now known as The Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park. Cleven was a very active Calgary community leader and a well-known and respected businessman. He was one of 62 people who were killed in the crash of a TransCanada Airline flight which crashed on Mt. Slesse near Chilliwack on December 9<sup>th</sup>, 1956. He made many positive contributions to the start-up and laid a strong foundation for our club.

Members are nominated by Club Members with a review by a Committee, followed by our Club Board of Directors’ support. Club Cleven Award nominations may be submitted by any member of the Club.”

Nominations with supporting letters will be accepted from **October 13 – November 17**. Award will be presented at the Club Xmas Social on **December 22** at Rotary House.

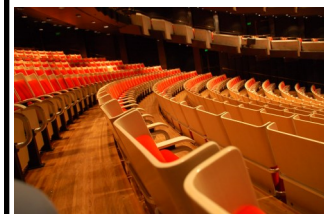

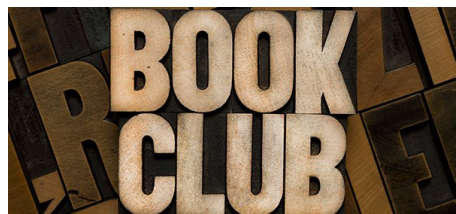
Here is what we have been waiting for - the start of the Christmas season!!! We are excited as we have lined up some pretty special entertainment and have a few surprises in store for everyone!

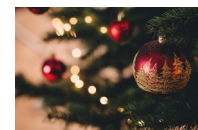
