Sylvia brings over 20 years of experience in senior leadership roles in the charitable sector. She is passionate about levelling the playing field for all youth to achieve their personal greatness.

Sylvia is delighted to bring donor and community partners values to life through educational programs that elevate student's personal experience and success.

Sylvia began her presentation with a video about a young boy named Brandon who disliked the rigidity of school and was underachieving.

His introduction to this program has led him changing his perspective and he is now achieving success in his normal schooling.



BULLETIN SYLVIA WHITWORTH: TEPF



The Education Partnership Foundation has been in operation for over 27 years. It offers free education programs across the City of Calgary and is expanding to other areas in the province. It has been shown that there is a need for this type of program in today's environment.

Trading Cards – essential to the program is it's used of "trading cards" to encourage young people to develop their reading skills and raise their literacy levels. Students work with a journeyman trades person. Their mentorship is extremely important and they are big "motivators". The foundation is collaborating with the Canadian National Geographic Society. A United Way survey found that it was extremely important for us to assist young people to develop a career in trades. Today more workers are retiring from the trades than the number of young people we are training to replace them, hence the shortage in qualified journeymen in industry. The aver-



age age for a person entering a trade is 26. It's clear that we must get younger people into the trades sooner in order to fill this gap.

The program offers work credit courses for students in grades 11 and 12. The students must complete 125 hours of training to obtain credits and there are usually 12 students in a class. All students are required to graduate from high school as they complete this program. The program has also received support from the unions and they are working to develop a larger set of union relationships.

It's important to change societal mindsets. The function of our educational system should not just s to provide educational programs that lead only to a university entrance. We need to convince people that blue collar jobs are also a fundament and viable part of our social structure. The foundation mourns the loss of the many vocational programs that existed in past in our high schools. These programs provided a niche for many students in our schools.

Sylvia then asked the club to: "share the information about this program with our friends and associates in business" and help the foundation to broaden it's contact base. THANK-YOU

A question was asked about intake times and Sylvia indicated that students could enter the program in the fall and in Feb., however the entrance from Feb. to June was proving to be more successful. The program was also a feeder for the Dual Credit programs at SAIT and NAIT.

President Chas adjourned the meeting saying that he was delighted to be the very FIRST President to be able to close the meeting of "THE ROTARY CLUB OF CAL-






