50/50: Jim Smith made us all laugh, as usual, at his role in 50/50 today. The pot was \$175 and went to **Carol Rosdobutko!!**










Calling All Snowbirds!

Elections

As **President Jim** mentioned, it is election time. As immediate Past-President of the Club I have been tasked with chairing the Nomination Committee this year. According to the bylaws of the Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park, the election process for President-Elect Nominee, Treasurer and 3 Directors is declared **open today, October 5, 2023**.

For the newer members, on the first day of an election, the Chair of the Nomination Committee must inform the Club of the nomination process. So here we go: The nomination process will be open for candidates from the club membership for a three (3) week period, closing at 12:00 pm on October 26, 2023. At that time, acceptance of additional nominations will cease. Nominations from Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park members can be submitted for each of the following positions: President-Elect Nominee, Treasurer, and three (3) Director positions.

Nomination forms for all positions are on Clubrunner. Members are requested to prepare a nomination form for each nominated candidate, and the form must be signed by the nominee showing their willingness to serve, if elected. Again, these forms must be dated and submitted to the Club Secretary, **Luanne**Whitmarsh no later than 12:00 pm on October 26, 2023. In the event we have more nominations submitted than there are positions to fill, we will then have an election.





Ballots will be electronically mailed to Club Members with a response requested within two (2) days. Ballots must be sent to the attention of myself. All candidates involved in the election process will have a short profile published in the bulletin prior to the election.

Here are the qualifications for the open positions:

The President-Elect Nominee must meet all of the following criteria:

- (a) Has been a Member of the Club for at least five (5) years and a Rotarian for at least eight (8) years,
- (b) Has served on the Board of Directors for at least one term,
- (c) Has demonstrated a strong commitment to the objects of Rotary throughout their tenure in the Club,
- (d) Is a Member in good standing of the Club having maintained 70% attendance in the previous two (2) years prior to his nomination and,
- (e) Has demonstrated a strong commitment to all Club expectations for involvement in Club activities such as committee work and fund raising activities and in particular, completion of Dream Home shifts as required by the Club.

A Director Nominee must meet all of the following criteria:

- (a) Has been a Member of the Club for at least three (3) years,
- (b) May not have served on the Board in the previous three (3) years in any position,
- (c) Must have demonstrated a strong commitment to the objects of Rotary throughout their tenure in the Club,
- (d) Is a Member in good standing in the Club having maintained seventy (70) % attendance in the previous two (2) years prior to his nomination and,
- (e) Has demonstrated a strong commitment to all Club expectations for involvement in Club activities such as committee work and fund raising activities and in particular, completion of Dream Home shifts as required by the Club.

A Club Treasurer Nominee must meet all of the following criteria:

- (a) Must be a Chartered Accountant or have similar designation,
- (b) Has been a Member of this Club for at least five (5) years,
- (c) Must have demonstrated a strong commitment to the objects of Rotary throughout their tenure in the Club,
- (d) Is a Member in good standing in the Club having maintained 70% attendance in the previous two (2) years prior to his nomination and,
- (e) Has demonstrated a strong commitment to all Club expectations for involvement in Club activities such as committee work and fund raising activities and in particular, completion of Dream Home shifts as required by the Club.

The current Club Vacancies are as follows: President-Elect Nominee, Three (3) Directors, Club Treasurer.

The Club Treasurer and three (3) Directors will serve for a two year term commencing on July 1, 2024 until June 30, 2026. The President-Elect Nominee will serve in that capacity until July 1, 2024. At that time; they will assume the role of President-Elect and serve for one year from July 1st 2024 to June 30, 2025. On July 1, 2025 until June 30, 2026 they will serve their term as President of our club.

Following our Club's bylaws, the President-Elect is entitled to nominate from the Membership, their candidates who meet the stated criteria for the positions of Secretary and Director. Our current **President-Elect Jim Bladon** will submit his nominees for the vacancies of Club Treasurer and Directors by the deadline. The Past Presidents of our Club met and they present **Gordon Wiecker** as President Elect Nominee.

As a reminder, any announced nominees are not intended to exclude any nominations from the general membership. Our Club bylaws provide for an open election wherever there are more nominations than vacancies to fill. Each week until October 26, I will announce the names of any additional nominees that are put forward from the general membership. So, I know this is a lot to take in and I thank you for your attention today. All this information is outlined in our Bylaws and of course you can reference them again if you wish.

Now lastly, I offer a sincere thank you to any members who are willing to allow their name to stand for any position. Thank you. -Past President Jim Fitzowich





Rotary Remembers 2023—Speaker Dr. Stéphane Guevremont

Rotary Remembers 2023 is scheduled for Saturday, November 11th, at 10:30 at the Carriage House Inn. Tickets are \$50 and include an address by speaker Dr. Stéphane Guevremont, the reading of Club Honor Rolls, the Moment of Silence, a Rotary Family War Story, and lunch.

Dr. Stéphane Guevremont is a professional and independent military historian. In the past he has been a military history professor at Mount Royal University and taught in the Faculty of Continuing Education at the University of Calgary. He is also a speaker and media commentator.

His talk is titled, "UKRAINE AND THE WORLD: The International War"

Dr. Guevremont will talk about the international ramifications of the Ukraine-Russia war. He will begin by laying out the background of Western involvement with Ukraine from 1991 to 2022.


Dr. Guevremont will describe conflicts of interest emerging between various nations since the war began. He will discuss political intrigues, corruption, and other forces at play regarding energy, food supplies, and other impacts on world economies.

As for the conflict itself, he will explain the unique organizational structure of the Ukrainian army, which differs from that of Canada, the USA, and Britain. Of particular interest, he will provide an overview of the International Brigades made up of volunteers from neutral nations and various anti-Russian countries in the region.

Stéphane Guevremont also organizes tours of Canadian battlefields in Europe. In his spare time, he plays several sports and does volunteer work with seniors and high school students.

The M.C. will be last year's keynote speaker, Jim Hennessy. The event will be produced by Robyn Braley and the Rotary Remembers Committee, which includes representatives of most Calgary Rotary Clubs.
