

Main Speaker: Ted Stack Kids at Heart Tournament Update

Ted gave an excellent summary on the inaugural Kids at Heart Golf Tournament held at Cottonwood Golf Course on July 21, 2022. The statement of the purpose of the Kids at Heart (KAH) program is: "To invest in the lives of children and youth to create real and long lasting change for kids, families and our community".





Tim Beach to rise and be acknowledged as our Title Sponsor. Tim Beach responded saying the tournament is one of his favorite days of the year, and all the good that it does for our community is unrivaled. He thanked us for being involved, and he assured us that for the foreseeable future, Charlesglen will continue to be the Title Sponsor for this event!

The three charities involved in the golf tournament, Safe Haven, Dare to Care and PREP were recognized, as we all have a commitment to help children and youth in our community who:

- Have nowhere to sleep tonight
- Are facing family turmoil
- Go to school hungry
- Are being bullied in person or taunted on social media
- Are just trying to fit in

A short video celebrating the <u>Kids at Heart Golf Tournament</u> was played.

Our charities shared in the largest pool of funds raised in our 22 year tournament history. As a team we raised \$236,460 and it's all going back to help the children and youth in our community through these charities. The following three recipient charities were introduced.

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Curtis Slator has been the Executive Director of the PREP Society for Individuals with Down Syndrome



for the past 5 years. PREP is a place where families who have a child with Down Syndrome can find community and the support required to ensure their child has the best possible opportunity to live an active and included life in their community. PREP was presented with a cheque in the amount of \$47,292. Chris said this money will go directly to their teen program for junior and senior high students with Down syndrome to work on their independence and communication skills so they can live as full a life as they possibly can in their schools.

Lisa Dixon-Wells is the founder and Executive Director of Dare to Care. Dare to Care is a Calgary based

charity that has been at the forefront of bully prevention programming since 1999, with extensive experience in schools, sports organizations and community groups. Dare to Care surpassed their one millionth participant milestone in 2021 and was recently awarded the Government of Alberta's Inspiration Award for Leadership in Bully Prevention and the Imagine Canada Award for Community Partnership. Dare to Care was presented a cheque in the amount of \$70,938. Lisa shared the story of Cameron, their youngest Dare to Care Ambassador at age 11 who volunteered at the tournament, who said the tournament was "the best day of his life". Lisa outlined that the tournament funds will subsidize 50 schools and almost 20,000 students getting the Dare to Care programming this year for kindergarten through grade nine.



Carolyn Holloway is Safe Haven Foundation's Community Engagement Officer and has been with the organization for ten years. Safe Haven was founded in 1996 by Karen and John Sherbut based on a personal



passion of what Karen wished she would have had when she experienced homelessness as a teenager herself. Their founding program, Haven's Way, provides long term homes for girls aged 14-24 ensuring they can stay safe, off the streets and in school. Safe Haven's newest initiative, Haven's Harbour, will welcome its first residents next month and will provide housing with supports to nine additional youth, graduating from Haven's Way and other like-minded programs, who want to continue their post-secondary education but do not have the means to do so. Joining her was Safe Haven board member Carmen Brouwer who was instrumental in finding some great prizes for our tournament. Safe Haven was presented with a cheque in the

amount of <u>\$118,230</u>. Carolyn was very appreciative of the funding which represents half of their annual operating expenses for their youth program. They do not receive any government funding or fee for service so they rely heavily on the generosity of organizations like our Rotary club.







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Ted concluded by thanking Toby Oswald-Felker, who Chaired this year's inaugural KIDS AT HEART program and all of the Program Committee members, the Tournament Committee members and every single one of our Sponsors, Prize donors, golfers and volunteers without whom we would not have been able to CELEBRATE our success today.

Thank the Speaker: President Jim Fitzowich thanked the speaker, **Ted Stack**, for a great presentation and for all his hard work as the Tournament chair. He also thanked all the tournament participants, including the golfers.

President Jim: On behalf of the Club we make a \$100 donation in your honour to the CRCF, which supports Calgary area Rotary Clubs do their good works.

Cleven Award

This special internal award of the Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park was established in 2006 to recognize the outstanding contribution of club members who take on significant responsibilities and commitments in furthering the work of our club.

The award is named the "Cleven Award" in honour of and recognition of Harry Cleven, first president of the Manchester Rotary Club 1955 now known as The Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park. Cleven was a very active Calgary community leader and a well-known and respected businessman. He was one of 62 people who were killed in the crash of a TransCanada Airline flight which crashed on Mt. Slesse near Chilliwack on December 9^{tth}, 1956. He made many positive contributions to the start-up and laid a strong foundation for our club.

Members are nominated by Club Members with a review by a Committee, followed by our Club Board of Directors' support. Club Cleven Award nominations may be submitted by any member of the Club."

Nominations with supporting letters will be accepted from **October 13 – November 17**. Award will be presented at the Club Xmas Social on **December 22** at Rotary House.

The Nomination Forms are on our Website under 'Organization' and then 'Documents' in the Member Area, or found here and will also be on the table of meetings for the next couple weeks.
