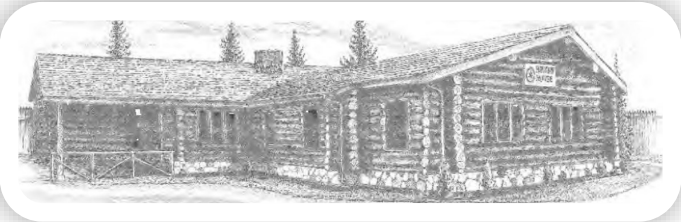


GUESTS: Ernie Yaskowich introduced our Guests followed by the **Welcome Song**

GUEST SPEAKERS: DR. MICHELE ANHOLT AND DR. HERMAN BARKEMA

Speaker Introduction: Sharyl Madigan



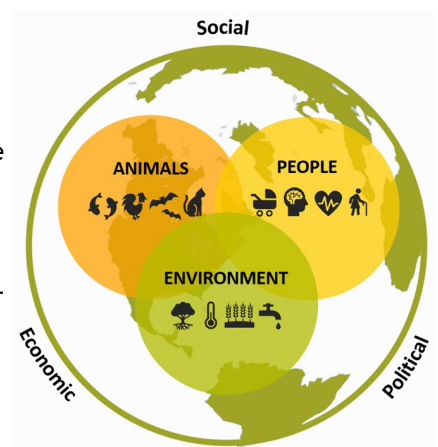
Dr. Michele Anholt: Dr. Michele Anholt completed her DVM at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine, Saskatoon in 1985. Most of the next 22 years was spent in companion animal practice in British Columbia and Alberta. She joined UCV as a graduate student in 2008, completing her PhD in epidemiology in early 2013. For the following 6 years, she was a self-employed veterinary epidemiologist examining population health challenges in a range of species from food and wild animals to people. Her clients were governments, not-for-profit organizations, and industry within Canada and elsewhere. She returned to the University of Calgary in May 2019 as manager of the One Health at UCalgary to help develop and advance the One Health Emerging Research Theme.

Dr. Herman Barkema: Dr. Herman Barkema completed his DVM degree at Utrecht University, The Netherlands, in 1988. He spent 2½ years as manager of a large dairy and beef herd in Costa Rica, then taught bovine herd health and completed his PhD in epidemiology at Utrecht University. He came to Canada to join the faculty at UPEI but came to Calgary to found UCV's Department of Production Animal Health. He currently is Professor in Epidemiology of Infectious Diseases at UCV and NSERC Industrial Research in Infectious Diseases of Dairy Cattle, with a joint appointment in the Department of Community Health Sciences of the Cumming School of Medicine. He leads the UCalgary Biostatistics Centre, the Environment research theme in the Canadian Bovine Mastitis Research Network, the Antimicrobial Resistance – One Health Consortium and One Health at UCalgary.

Speaker: Dr. Michele Anholt and Dr. Herman Barkema

One Health is an approach to complex problems that recognizes the inextricable links between animal-human-environmental health. A diverse and trans-disciplinary team can examine the upstream determinants of health by considering the social, economic, and political contexts of the problem. Goal is to find sustainable and equitable solutions that improve the well-being of people and animals and that respects natural limits

We asked the University community, “How do we train the next generation of One Health researchers and practitioners?” On January 29, 2021 and in collaboration with Werklund School of Education and UCalgary's Knowledge Engagement team, we held a Design Thinking Session with public school teachers and curriculum developers.



Len Hamm thanked the speakers for their presentation today.

In Closing: Michele and Herman; thank you for taking the time to visit us today. In recognition of your time today, you have both earned a Pet Care and Science Badge. District Conference 2022

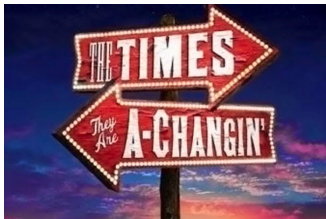

NOVEMBER 4th: Tyler Williamson, PhD: Funds Usage / Pandemic Review

Tyler Williamson is the Associate Director here at the Centre for Health Informatics. In addition, he is an Associate Professor of Biostatistics in the Department of Community Health Sciences at the University of Calgary and a member of the [O'Brien Institute of Public Health](#) and the [Alberta Children's Hospital research Institute](#). His research interests include health data integration (combining electronic medical record and health administrative data), chronic disease surveillance and research using electronic medical record data, and non-canonical link functions for binomial generalized linear models. He is a national and internationally recognized in the use of electronic medical record data for public health surveillance, health services research, and practice quality improvement working with organizations such as the Public Health Agency of Canada and Health Canada's Marketed Health Products Directorate.

Work at the Centre for Health Informatics at the Cumming School of Medicine is partially supported by the recent awarding of a \$100,000 grant from the Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park.
