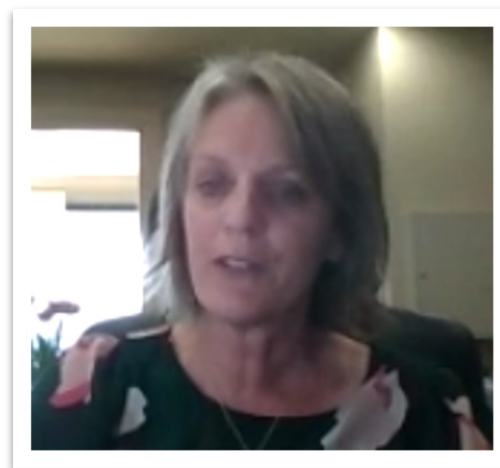
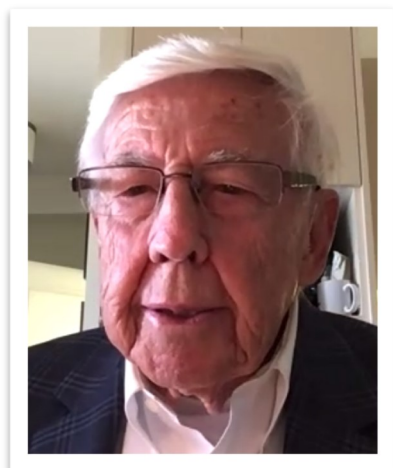

CATHERINE RUSSELL, GM: AMICA



Dick Shaw via Zoom introduced **Catherine Russell**, the General Manager of Amica in Aspen Woods (a Senior's Living Facility). Catherine Russell is here today to talk to us about the precautions they took to protect the residents of this facility.

Catherine Russell began today by saying that In the early stages it was important to develop plans to prevent the disease from gaining a foothold in the facility. They chose to develop anacronyms to achieve this. The first was STOP, TAKE, ISOLATE and MASK.

Leadership jumped to the forefront as one of the biggest issues. Few could have predicted what was to come and they found they had continually develop plans to face "uncertainty". How do we "hedge the risk". The early days felt like they were in a "video game" They were in the front lines facing a survival crisis with the covid numbers surging. It was like running a race. They were forced to solve problems quickly, be aware of limits and most importantly survive! In addition it was important to develop strategies that would survive in the future.

It was important to look at "worst case" scenarios. Amica had one of the best records for seniors facilities not only in Calgary but also at the rest of their facilities across the nation. There are over 50 senior facilities in Alberta and things could go wrong easily and quickly. Amica had a remarkable record in this regard.

Currently they are working on ways to combat the disease. They are involved in several clinical trials, one of which is plasma testing all working to continue to keep people safe.

Catherine took the time to show us pictures of the facility, describing the various rooms, meeting spaces, recreations areas including the home theatre and spa. They have 24/7 nursing capability and a gardeners area and craft kitchens for their residents to use. They provide both independent and assisted living, convalescent care and offer trail stays to prospective residents.

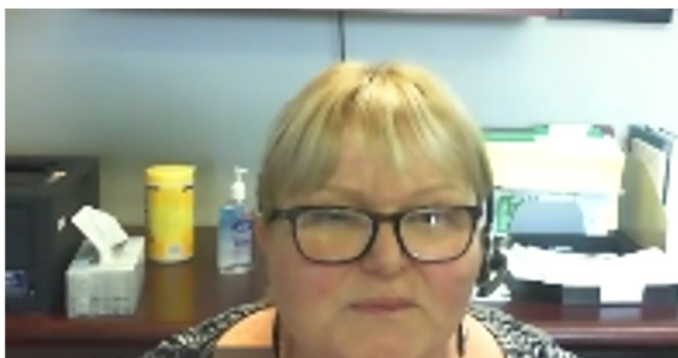


We were shown a video that the Calgary Herald had prepared of their residents, many of whom belonged to the Amica Singers, singing from the balconies of the facility.

The Past President's Nominee for President-Elect for the 2023 / 2024 Rotary year is: **Jim Fitzowich**

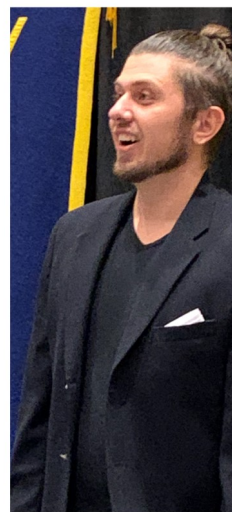

October 2, 2020 – Calgary, Alberta

Roderick (Rod) Campbell Bower, beloved husband of Penelope Bower (nee Owen), and father of Christopher and Nicholas, passed away on Friday, October 2, 2020 at the age of 83 years after a brief battle with cancer.

Dad had interests in sports his entire life, and not only played college football and basketball and had tryouts for the Edmonton Eskimos as an Offensive Lineman, but also coached both sports in St. Albert, Alberta. Earning a Master of Science in Water

Resources and his BSc in Civil Engineering from The University of Manitoba, Rod's career in Engineering spanned forty years, twenty-five of which were with the UMA Group.

A lifelong wanderlust brought Rod to contracted work in Sri Lanka, where he met and fell in love with Penelope, and they were married on December 28, 1967, returning to Canada in 1974 with two very young boys. His career allowed for extensive travel to places like Ecuador, Uzbekistan, India, and Africa where his two sons, Christopher and Nicholas were born.

Rod was also a dedicated Rotarian, and coupled with Penny's work with The Samaritan club had a hand in the betterment of communities in St. Albert, Regina, and of course Calgary.

Rod is survived by his sons, Nicholas Michael, Christopher Roderick and wife Shelley, and by his grandson James Huxley. Rod did not have siblings, and was predeceased by his loving wife Penelope, father Frank and mother Blanche.

As per Dad's wishes, there will not be a service, and we will be creating a memorial family plaque here in Calgary in the future.
