Lisa Van Hemert gave us an update on community grants applications. The application is open until September 30. If you know of any registered charities out there, please make them aware that they have till September 30 to get their applications into us. It's a really important process for our club, so we'd like to have as many projects as possible to choose from.

Steve Austin introduced our guest speaker Dr Thomas Keenan. Dr Keenan is both a seasoned it professional and a popular professor at the University of Calgary. He taught Canada's first computer security course in 1977 and was involved in the creation of the country's first computer crime laws. He has spoken on five continents and is the author of over 2000 academic and professional publications. He is Vice Chair of the information and communications technology council and a fellow of the Canadian information processing society and the Canada Global Affairs Institute. His 2000 book techno creep, the surrender of privacy and the capitalization of intimacy, introduced ideas like image fakery, identity theft and creepy surveillance technologies that are now in the news almost every day.



Dr. Tom Keenan, a renowned IT professional and professor at the University of Calgary, discussed the evolving landscape of privacy and surveillance. He highlighted his book "Techno Creep," which predicted the exponential growth of privacy invasions. Keenan shared examples like Al-generated emails and facial recognition in retail settings. He emphasized the potential for phones to eavesdrop and the dangers of malware. Keenan also touched on the implications of smart homes and the use of biometric data for surveillance. He concluded by stressing the importance of being aware of technological advancements and their impact on privacy. I encourage everyone to flip through his presentation which is linked **HERE**
