

The International Airport is an 80 year lease to 2072





Economic Impact of YYC

• A vital part of the Calgary and Alberta economy creating 24,000 on airport jobs, YYC creates 48,000 jobs for the region and are responsible for creating more than \$8.28 billion in GDP

Jody advised that YYC pushes all of their partners to operate well so it is a positive customer experience from entry to exit.

Visitors will be impressed by the new terminal the first time they see and experience it as we were today by the update on the new developments at YYC.


Guests: "No Joke" Jack Haman introduced our Guests.

There was discussion of the reconstruction of the Silk Road involving Iran, Iraq, South Africa, etc. The Waterton Glacier concept is a model for other countries regarding cross-border cooperation. President Ken thanked Terry Allen for his two years as President.



Terry Fox Run: Larry Stein asked his Committee and the other volunteers who participated in last Sunday's registration for the Terry Fox run to stand and be recognized. There were approximately 1400 participants at this year's run and \$100,000.00 was raised. The Terry Fox Foundation was grateful for our assistance.

Cleven Awards: Terry Allen gave a brief history of the awards-named after Harry Cleven, the first President of our predecessor club who tragically died in an airplane crash

in 1956. This award was created in 2006 as a way to honour him by recognizing those club members who go above and beyond expectations. To be considered, a member must have 5 plus years of membership as well as an attendance of at least 75% over the past 3 years. Forms were available at the front table. Either email or hand in your nomination form to Terry. All nominations must be in by October 6, 2016. This allows the Committee to review and make final recommendations before the award or awards are presented on November 17.





Rotary Challenger Park: Jim Burns will be calling a Committee meeting soon but did have an update from the Park's Executive Director. The Golf Tournament was a sell out this year. The Calgary Airport Authority (CAA) will remain as the main sponsor for this annual event for 5 years. The Park's share of the proceeds was \$55,000. The Park and CAA have signed a 72 year lease for the use of the land. Renfrew Academy, a key tenant of the Park is looking at constructing a building at the Park. Although grants may be reduced due to the economic downturn, planning is still proceeding.
