The April 23rd New Member's Auction evening was filled with smiles and greetings!


The silent and live auction items were plentiful and well received. Thanks to all who contributed to the success of this event. The funds from this event go directly towards our Club expenses.


well done for this event.


You might remember the grocery shopping and dish washing, but our families remember the food you served. The children remember being able to spend time with their parents because there was no concern about who was cooking.




