

Rae Kells: Curling Canada






Penny Leckie introduced our Guest Speaker Rae Kells. Rae has instructed Curling for over 32 years, she ran the Junior Programs for Sherwood Park and Ottawa, coached junior women's and women's teams for over 14 years. Rae currently holds a Level 3 Instructor/ Coach and Level 5 Official Certification. Among many other awards for volunteering in the Curling world, Rae also received the Ray Kingsmith Memorial Award in 2007 and has to date officiated at 39 National and International **Championships including 3 Winter Olympic** Games, Torino, Vancouver and Sochi. Rae gave us a behind the scenes look at the world and history of Curling. Curling competitions first appeared on TV in the 70's and this changed the world of Curling in many ways. One of the biggest changes was the introduction of Officials at the games. This was done because it was noted that at the Briar in Calgary in 1980 there was over 3000 infractions that were documented. The first officiating course was offered in Edmonton and now all professional curling competitions are officiated.

Curling became a perfect TV sport as the players don't wear helmets so they are easy to see, they wear RF microphones so we can hear what they are saying (which can sometimes be not so good if the language is colorful! Some innovations also helped it become a more popular TV sport, the electronic handle to replace "eyes" on the hog line and time clocks to keep the play moving!

Video replay is only used to reposition stationary stones all other decisions are eyes on the Field of Play in real time unlike many other professional sports! We learned just how much time and energy it takes to keep all the sponsors happy at the Briars as there can be many things that affect the level of exposure that the sponsor gets. The Chief Umpire is responsible for ALL that happens within the Field of Play whether it's a camera man, photographer, player, umpire, spectator and even the odd streaker!



The winners (and a few others) were promptly relieved of some of their winnings by Sergeant at Arms Jack Thompson, who used some Super Bowl trivia to stump the room!





History Moments Rotary Club of Calgary South 1955 -2015

History Moments will be published on a regular basis in our Club Bulletin as a lead up to our Sixtieth Anniversary meeting on April 2nd. The primary source for these articles will be our Fiftieth Anniversary Publication: Manchester to Calgary South 1955- 2005 authored by Peter Penner.

In The Beginning

Excerpts from Manchester to Calgary South 1955 - 2005

District Governors

During the past 60 years, the Rotary Club of Calgary South has had 4 of our members selected to lead as District Governors. These profiles are brief, members are encouraged to read Manchester to Calgary South for more information.

Orville Burke - 1955 - 1967

Orville Burke was a charter member of the Manchester Rotary Club & became the 2nd president of the Club in '56-'57 and District Governor in '66-'67. Orville Burke served in the 2nd World War and then set up a business in Calgary. He was the quarterback of the Ottawa Rough Riders from 1936-1941. As outlined in Peter Penner's book it was noted that he was a gifted speaker and an able successor to Harry Cleven who had died in a plane accident the year before. As president of the club he strongly supported "club service as an important part of the 4 Avenues of Service. He believed that the success of any club depended on three things: good food, good fellowship & a good program. Burke was selected as the D.G. for 1966-1967, and had the full support of his Club, however during the year his economic situation changed and he had to move away. He passed away in Vancouver in 1995.

Bob Dawson- 1955-2003

Bob was a Rotarian for 48 years and established a reputation within the Club as a person who used humour at every opportunity to engage his audience. Bob joined the Club a few weeks after the Charter date and served as Club President in '71-'72 and as D.G. in '79-'80. Howard Miller in giving Bob's eulogy at his service in July, 2003 told of his amazing business career which included car sales, real estate, mobile homes, the oil patch, TV stations and golf courses. He was a visionary who dreamed dreams and made them a reality. Bob kept us laughing, an accomplished speaker, forever telling jokes, mainly about himself and his wonderful wife Gynell. Gynell still participates in many of our Rotary functions and actively supports our Rotary activities to the best of her ability. Bob was instrumental in initiating the planting of trees for each member of the Club which began in River Park in Altadore in '72. At the park can be found a bench with a bronze plaque suitably inscribed as to the donation of the Rotary Club. Since that time our Club has continued the practice of tree planting on a regular basis as space and funds have allowed. These are planted to recognize our new members, deceased members & current Club President, RI and the District Governor. Bob Dawson was indeed a memorable and significant Rotarian at all levels of Rotary and made a significant contribution to the culture of our Rotary Club.

Gardie Shaw 1964 - 2006

Gardie was a Rotarian for over 40 years and served as President of the club in '70-'71 and as D.G. in '84-'85. Gardie had many business interests including construction and automotive dealerships. As Club President he was remembered for his sense of humour and generosity and his ability to motivate members in fund raising activities. In his role as past D.G. Gardie and an entourage of Rotarians and Calgary mayor Al Duerr travelled to RI headquarters and convinced the Board of RI to award the International Convention to Calgary for '96. The RI Convention proved to be one of the best with 40 committees and 1400 volunteers ensuring a top notch convention for Rotarians from around the world.

Ken Copithorne - 1968

Ken continues to serve our club in many capacities. He was Club President in '85- '86 and D.G. in '04- '05. Ken was inspired by the Polio plus Program and believed that Rotary was probably the "only body of people who can bring this type of program to conclusion". Ken believed strongly in a 'team approach' and gave credit to a strong board and club secretary, Pat Deegan. Ken served as D.G. during the 100th Anniversary of Rotary and planned and executed many celebrations for Rotary's birthday. These included a tree planting program in the district in conjunction with the 100th Birthday of the Province as well. The Centennial Birthday celebration was held at the Round up Centre with 700 in attendance. Ken promoted many other activities at each of the clubs that he visited during his year and was assisted by his wife Wendy in all of these endeavours. Our Club continues to be the benefactor of Ken's auctioneering skills at the New Members' Auction and the S.I.S.S.P. Golf Tournament. More will be written about Ken in the 10 Year History to be published in the early fall of '15.




Hello Ladies:


