Chas Filipski introduced our guest speaker Dr. Monique Dube who is the Chief Environmental Scientist for the Alberta Energy Regulator. Dr. Dube brings over 25 years of experience to the Alberta Energy Regulator. She has published over 200 contributions and is a recognized expert in the field of cumulative effects assessment and environmental ecotoxicology. Her work has influenced federal legislation, national environmental impact assessment practices, and cumulative effects assessments for Canadian fresh waters, as well as contributed to the development of technology for wastewater treatment and decision support software for cumulative effects assessment.

Monique has received numerous awards – including the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council synergy Award, Canadian Geographic Scientist of the Year, and YWCA Women of Distinction.

Monique is an avid outdoor enthusiast. She spends her time training as an ultramarathon endurance athlete, practising her singing and song-writing talents, and enjoying family time with her husband Todd and her children Emily and Thomas.

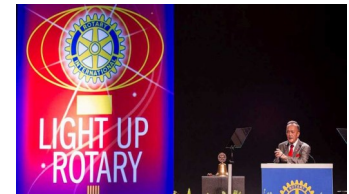
Monique's presentation was centred on the AER Environment : Preparing for the Future.

Here are some the highlights from Dr. Monique Dube's presentation:

About the Alberta Energy Regulator:

- » Established in June 2013; an amalgamation of the old ERCB and the regulatory functions from the old Alberta ESRD
 - "lift and shift" model; all regulatory functions were moved but not changed. Now into transformation phase.
- » June 2014, mandate expanded to include additional environmental responsibilities.
 - examine existing environmental functions and consider environmental performance improvement opportunities to better serve stakeholders.
- » Sept 2014, hired a "Chief Environmental Scientist" to help fulfill its new mandate and commitment to environmental performance improvement.

Dr. Dube and her team are committed to taking a "balanced" approach to the Environment and Resource Development because they are not mutually exclusive. The AER recognizes one, cannot live without the other and that the energy sector is incredibly important to the Alberta and Canadian economy.

Monique is working on a 3 year plan with 4 themes:

Theme 1 : Monitoring Environmental Performance – Cumulative Effects management

Theme 2: Responsible and Adaptive Environmental Management- Review existing legislation to clarify the mandate and share the review with all stakeholders.

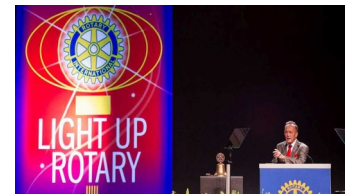
Theme 3: Environmental Cooperation and Alignment – Increase cooperation with the Multi-faceted organization. Synthesize and prioritize key environmental issues in the energy sector.

Theme 4: Recognize Environmental Expertise – best in class environmental expertise and the sharing of innovation and science around the world.

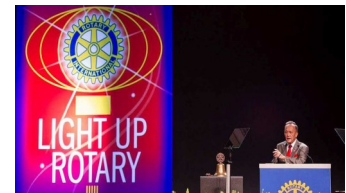
Mel Gray

SISSP Luncheon: Next week is the Stay in School luncheon at the Carriage House Inn. Please register online asap so the committee can arrange catering needs.

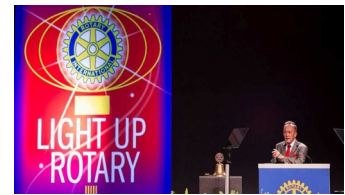

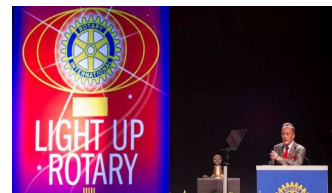

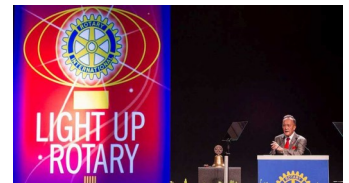
The last day at the conference is kind of sad. Because we know that it'll be the last time all of us might get together. Everyone is crying and say goodbye to other.

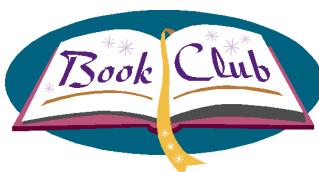

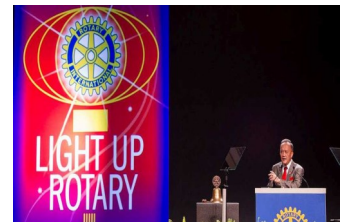


The final Partner's Book Club until fall will be held on June 15th (Monday) at 10:00 am at The Lott Creek Community Centre. Directions are as follows:

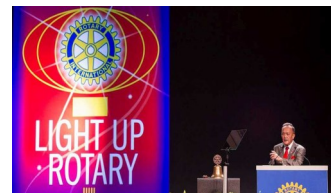

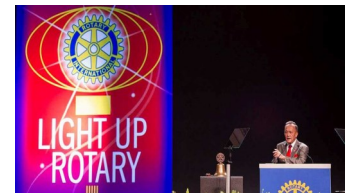
