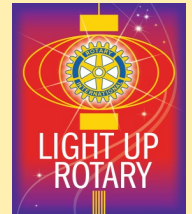

Doug Hagedorn: Computer Screens for the Blind

Douglas Hagedorn CEO of Tactalis was introduced by Sherry Austin, who told us that Doug has been a resident of Calgary for 11 years when he moved here from St Albert to attend U of C. He completed an undergraduate degree in Urban Studies and then a Master's Degree in Geography. Doug told us how he got a \$400 Scholarship from Rotary and when he came to Calgary he bought a bike to get around This developed into a passion for cycling and eventually, through various twists and turns , led us to his current venture ---- Tactalis.



Doug is a lifelong tinkerer and entrepreneur, involved in a variety of start-ups. He has come up with a touchscreen computer with tactile output designed to serve the unmet needs of the blind and visually impaired.

TACTALIS.... "A new way to touch". Doug advised us that 285 million people in the world are unable to see digital images and they have come up with a way to touch and then "feel" a computer screen. Braille has always been used to communicate by touch on paper but the world has changed and now we have touch screens for information but visually impaired cannot read them. Numerous companies throughout the world are now the subject of some 15,000 "Blind Accessibility Lawsuits" including Airlines, Hotels, Retailers and Universities. Imagine trying to check in at an airport kiosk or look up the store location in a mall!

Tactalis' solution is to provide the individual with feedback from the screen as it is touched. They have developed the screen and the technology and now need practical applications and content to take it forward. They have identified 10 areas where this technology could be applied. Here are some examples of usage: Education: Replace Braille Books, Communicate what is on the Chalk Board. Maps: Weather, Navigation, Info Kiosks: ATM's, Service Terminals. Small Business: Cash Registers, Help to earn a livelihood. Travel: being able to book events, flights. Museums: descriptions of items they are not able to see. Games and recreation: Ski hill maps, Monopoly board. Home integration: TV channel lists, Thermostats. Many Health applications like stroke and tremor help. Heads up Displays: Crane operators, radio controlled models.

Tactalis has won numerous awards for their invention and innovation and are now ready to take it to the next level. They need PARTNERS, FUNDING, ADVISORS, STAFF, OFFICE SPACE, CUSTOMERS AND USERS, but most of all they need us to spread the word. You can go to www.tactalis.com to get more information.

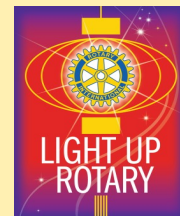

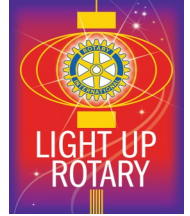
And after I went to the mall. Ron and I went far north to have dinner with Mark. It's a really good meal.

What is the Calgary Rotary Clubs Foundation?

It is a place where all Calgary Rotary Clubs can invest their charitable funds and is overseen by a Board representing all participating clubs. Each year funds are distributed according to a pre-agreed formula to these clubs. We have about \$2.6 million invested at this time and about 5% is returned to our Club on an annual basis.

Why should I donate?

There are no administrative fees for this Foundation. Every dollar you donate goes directly into the Foundation. All funds that you commit will remain in our local community to help those in need. Through your generosity you will help feed those who are hungry, help house those who are homeless, help those living with disabilities, help those who are sick, and help those who just need your support to re-build their lives so they, too, may contribute to their community.

How are donations recognized?

Donor recognition begins at \$1000 and you receive a Calgary South Benefactor pin, a personalized certificate, and your name is included on the Donor Recognition Board. Each successive donation of \$1000 includes crystals on the benefaction pin.

What are our Club targets?

Our goal is to raise \$4 million for this Foundation.

We would like to encourage all members to work toward becoming a Calgary South Benefactor. All donations are gratefully received and records will be kept for you.

How do I make a donation?

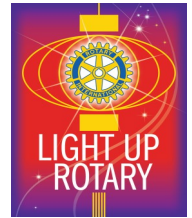
Donations can be made by credit card, cheque, or cash. Donations may be made by corporations, families and other supporters of the work we do in our own community.

We finished with lunch at the Italian Farmhouse in Bragg Creek, which we highly recommend. It was delicious.

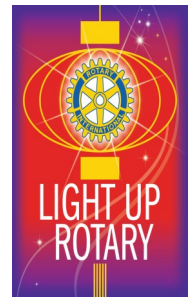

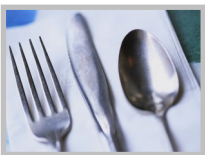

Rotary Club of Calgary South: 2014 Election Process

On Oct. 9 nomination period will open for all positions to be elected this year. These positions are:

- Directors for the 2015 – 2017 Term. Four in total.
- President-Elect Nominee. This person will become the President-elect on Jul. 1, 2015 and will be President for the 2016-2017 Rotary year.
- Secretary for 2015-2017 Year.

The timeline for the election process is as follows:

1. Oct. 2: Chair of Nominating Committee will announce to club that nominations will open on Oct. 9 and will outline nomination process. The Chair (or designate) will repeat this notification at each of the meetings of Oct. 9, 16 and 23. Notification will also be published in the club Bulletin in those dates.
2. Oct. 9: Nominations will open for all positions to be elected.
The Oct. 9 *Bulletin* will publish nomination forms. As well, an email will be sent to all Members in Good Standing containing names of members eligible for election to the position of Director, and position of President-Elect Nominee.
3. Printed copies of nomination forms will be available from the Secretary, Ted Rowsell, at each of the meetings of Oct. 9, Oct. 16 and Oct. 23
4. All completed Nomination Forms must be in the hands of Secretary Ted Rowsell no later than 12:00 Noon on Thursday, Oct. 30. Nominations MUST be received in the standard format of the Nomination Form, stating:
 - Position being sought by the Nominee
 - Name of Nominee, including signed declaration by Nominee of their willingness to stand for election and to serve if elected
 - Nominating signatures of 2 Members in Good Standing of club eligible to vote.
5. *Nominations will close at 12:00 Noon on Thursday, Oct. 30. If sufficient, or fewer number of candidates are nominated by the deadline for nominations, then the slate of candidates will be declared elected by acclamation, and Nominating Committee will be directed to appoint sufficient Directors to meet requirements (in this case, four Directors in total are required).*
6. If more candidates are nominated than positions to be filled, an election will ensue in order to collect secret ballots from all Members in Good Standing. Process will be as follows:
 - On Thurs. Nov. 6, a brief profile of each eligible candidate will be published in the *Bulletin*. It is the responsibility of each candidate to prepare an abbreviated profile in standard format, and to submit that profile to Past-President Keith Davis (Chairman, 2014 Nomination Committee). This must be done before the Nov. 6 regular meeting of Club, in order that they can be published in the Nov. 6 *Bulletin*.
 - On Monday, Nov. 10 ballots, showing names of all nominees for all positions, will be sent to all Members in Good Standing of the club. Ballots will include name of candidates, positions they are seeking election to, name of person who nominated them, and name of person who seconded that nomination.
 - All ballots must be received by the Secretary of the club not later than 12:00 Noon on Thursday, Nov. 20 in order to be counted.
 - Nominating Committee, as set out by Club bylaws, will be a committee made up of the Past Presidents of our club.
This committee will meet on Oct. 14, 2014 to identify a candidate for the position of President-Elect Nominee and, upon the consent of that candidate, his/ her name will be made known to members of Club by the Chairman of the Nominations Committee. His/her name will also be included on the ballot as a nominee for that position. However, all Members in Good Standing of the club will also be encouraged to submit nominations for the position of President-Elect Nominee, in addition to the name put forward by the Past Presidents.

Any questions regarding this election process should be directed to me, as Chair of the Nominating Committee.

- All Nominations must be signed by a nominator and seconder who are in good standing as members of the Rotary Club of Calgary South, as well as the candidate who is being nominated for the position.

Rotary Club of Calgary South Cleven Awards Program

This special Calgary South Club internal awards program was established in 2006 to recognize the outstanding contribution of club members who take on significant responsibilities and commitments in furthering the work of our club.

The award is named the “Cleven Award” in honor of and recognition of the first president of the Rotary Club of Calgary South chartered as the Manchester Rotary Club in 1955. Harry Cleven was a very active Calgary community leader and a well-known and respected business man. He was one of 62 people who were killed in the crash of a TransCanada Airlines flight which crashed on Mt. Slesse near Chilliwack on December 9th 1956. He made many positive contributions to the startup and a strong foundation for our Rotary Club.

We already have sixteen members in this special program and expect to induct another two or three this year. New members are nominated by club members with a review by a committee, followed by our club Board of Directors support.

We need your input for future Club Cleven Award nominees and following you will find the important criteria.

CRITERIA

- Ø The award recognizes a strong commitment to and involvement in all club activities.
- Ø The nominee should be an active participant in club committees, who accepts major responsibilities in the committee. They should demonstrate a strong work ethic and timely completion of commitments.
- Ø Members of Rotary Club of Calgary South with membership of at least 5 years qualify for this award.
- Ø Nominees for this award must have an attendance over the last three years of at least 75%.
- Ø This award does not have any repeat winners.

NOMINATION PROCESS

- Ø Nominations can be made by members of the Club through a nomination letter and/or by members of the Recognition and Award Committee.
- Ø Deadlines for nominations will be published in the Bulletin.
- Ø The Recognition and Awards Committee will receive the nominations and make recommendations to the Board for those Club Members who will receive this award.
- Ø The Board is responsible for approving the recommendation of the committee.
- Ø The Award will be presented at a time to be determined by the Board.

GUIDELINES FOR THE RECOGNITION AND AWARDS COMMITTEE

- Ø Normally, there will be 1 to 2 recipients per year.
- Ø Presidents and District Governors are not eligible until 5 years after serving term.
- Ø Members of the Recognition and Awards Committee are not eligible.
- Ø The profile of club committees varies with the type of work, it is therefore important that the Recognition and Awards Committee ensure that all nominations which are received for this award are given equal consideration.
- Ø The Committee will meet within two weeks of the nomination deadline to review the nominees and choose appropriate recipients which will be approved by the Board.
