

Sick to Death of the Silence



A compelling title to today's presentation by John Gulak and Cindy Radu. John and Cindy were introduced by Penny Leckie who had an interesting connection with the speakers.

Penny's and Cindy's paths crossed professionally many years ago, working with mutual clients and becoming friends. Penny spoke to us about Cindy's struggle with depression and her involvement in the book titled "Sick to Death of the Silence". Cindy partnered with John Gulak on the book project and it turns out that John and Penny went to High School in Lloydminster. John; a Corporate Lawyer is currently in-house counsel for a private group. John started out by giving us an overview of the Book which focuses on Mental Health


- What it is Mental illness about?
- What are we trying to achieve?
- Why is it important to talk about Mental Health?

"Sick to Death of the Silence" is coffee table style book with compelling photographs that relay the personal story of 15 Calgarians with mental illness.

The individuals come from all backgrounds including a father dealing with a death of a young daughter from suicide, to a young registered nurse with 3 children and a bipolar disorder. John emphasized that it was not a clinical book but you will learn something about your fellow Calgarian's experiences.

Sick to Death of the Silence - Continued

The book is intended to heal by storytelling. Silence, secrecy and shame played a part for those that are telling their story. All the stories were unique but had a common theme in doing their part in "normalizing" the discussion of Mental illness.

Mental illness is an important topic to discuss openly because one in five Canadians will experience mental health issues in their life time. Mental Illness is the leading cause of long term disability and the only way things will change is to talk about it. We talk openly about hip replacements and cataract surgery but lower our voice when talking about mental health issues. Having set the stage John turned things over to Cindy who spoke frankly and emotionally about her own experience with this disease. She told us about her first episode in 2002 and more recently her second episode which has led to her being on disability leave for almost a year. An experience with an attempted suicide by a friend in 2010 sparked Cindy to action to write a "Book". She subsequently enlisted John and with encouragement from friends and family the project took legs. By this time Cindy was on the Board of Canadian Mental Health Association, Calgary, and had their support. A photographer was engaged (Cole Grey) and the stories of the individuals were gradually developed. Cindy left us with an overview of Mental Illness in our City and why dialogue was important particularly as adults talking to our children, nieces, nephews and

grandchildren.

"My illness is part of who I am; it is my weakness and my strength. It is my deep desire that this book will open a refreshing new dialogue that is based not in ignorance and fear but in understanding and compassion"


Cindy received a standing ovation and both the speakers were thanked by Roselyn Jack. The cost of production for the book was funded by donations with proceeds from the sales going to the Canadian Mental Health Association. A representative was doing brisk sales at the end of the meeting.


President Al closed the meeting on time reminding everyone to *Light Up Rotary*!




