Our grant provides funding for wall-mounted vital-signs machines in each patient area of the Emergency Department at the Oilfields General Hospital in Diamond Valley. There are 8 patient spaces. A vital-signs machine will be installed in each space. The equipment will have an impact on efficiency for nursing staff, increased monitoring of patient status, and a decreased infection risk.

The funds provided by our club make possible the purchase and commissioning of an additional MANVAN to support prostate cancer screening.
